JAMES E. SHEPARD--Educator--Born Nov. 3, 1875, Raleigh North Carolina. Educated at Shaw University, Raleigh, N. C., 1886-1894., Ph.G. Shaw University 1894; Muskingum College, Ohio.; Theology, D. D. Muskingum College 1910; A. M. Selma Univ., Ala., 1912; Howard Univ. Litt.D. 1925. Comparer of Deeds, Recorder's office, Washington, C. C. 1898 and 1900; Deputy Collector, U. S. Internal Revenue, Raleigh, N. C. 1899-1906; President, National Training School, Durham, N. C. 1910-23; President Durham State Normal School, 1923-25; President, North Carolina College for Negroes 1925-Present; mem. K. of P; Odd Fellows; Director Farmers and Mechanics Bank; .President Interdenominational School Convention, 1909-14; Trustee Lincoln Hospital; Grand Master, F. & A. Masons 1920. Politics, Republican; Religion Baptist.

Dr. Shepard was the only Negro Speaker, at the World Sunday School Convention held in Italy 1910. He has traveled extensively in Europe, Asia and Africa.
