One of the new teachers to enlighten the campus at SCC this year is Maurice Maxwell. He has a B.S. from Emory Henry College. There, he

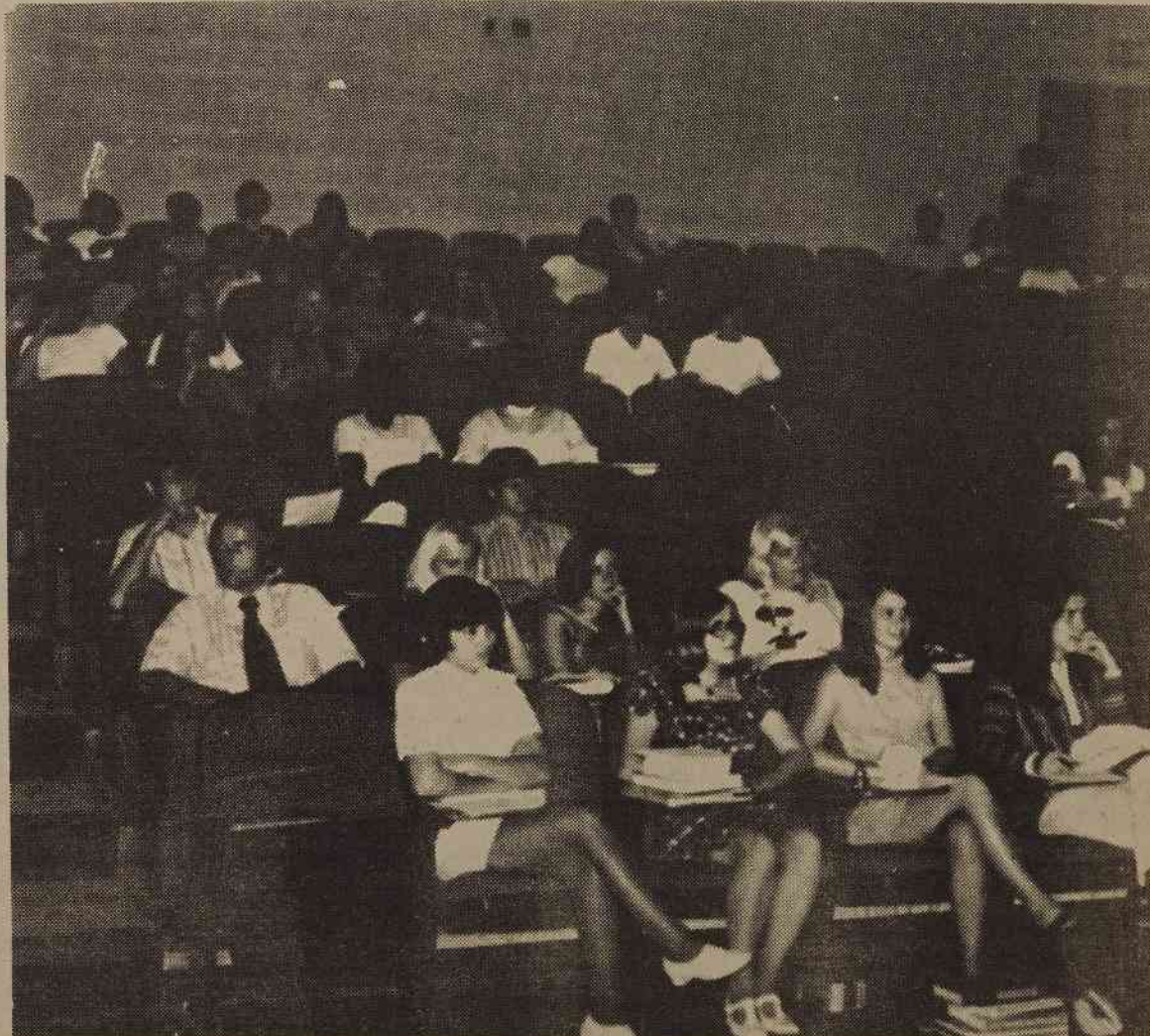
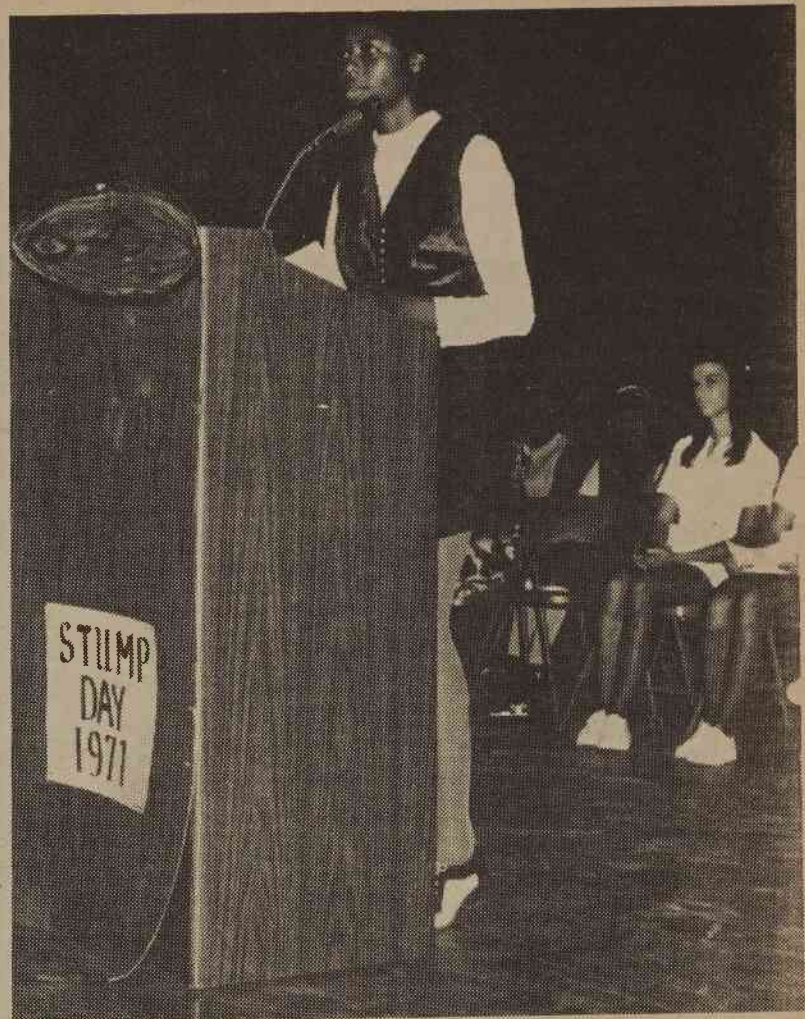
majored in chemistry and minored in physics and mathematics. Maxwell graduated from West Virginia University with a Ph. D. in organic chemistry.
