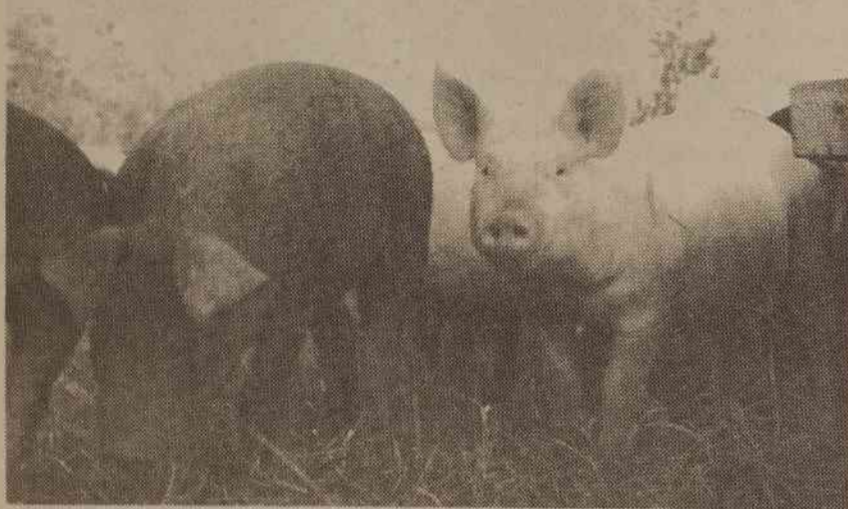
Other instances which disturbed this noteworthy group are the disgusting ashes and cigarette butts on the floors of the buildings and

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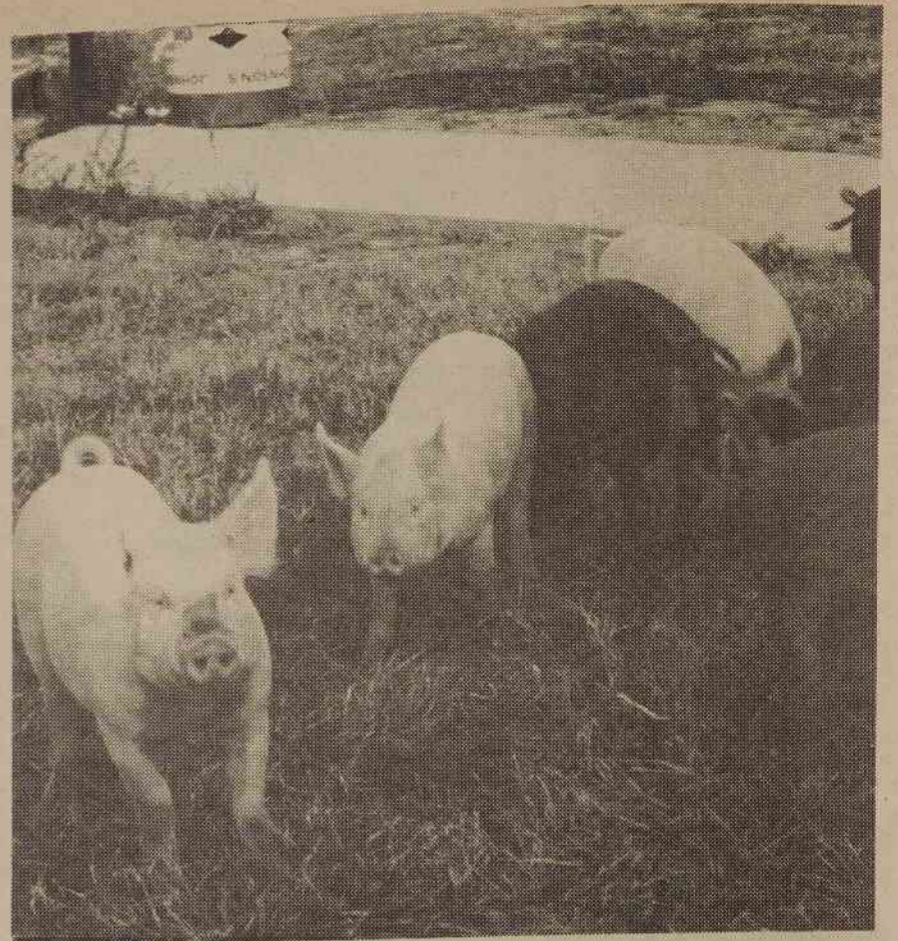
POEM

not human.

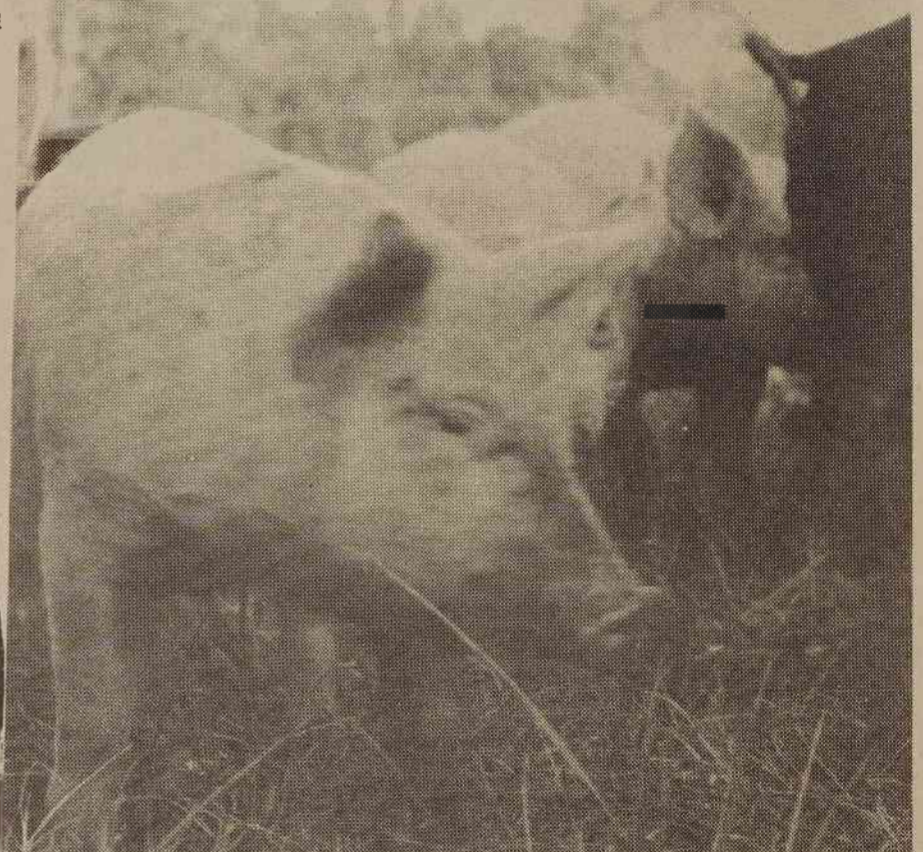
Then is

do.

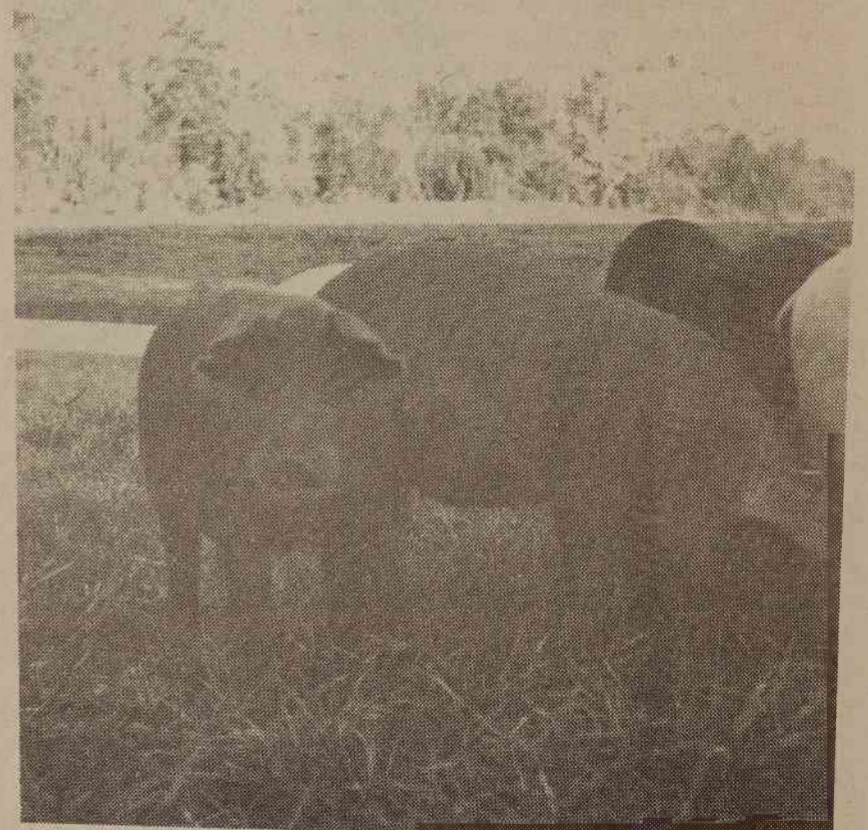
Then why
