Phil McRae, outstanding golfer and most valuable player in 1976, will lead the Rams again in 1977. As co-captain, along with Ernie Cain last year, Phil led the conference with a 74.7 season average. He was also Medalist in the conference tournament.

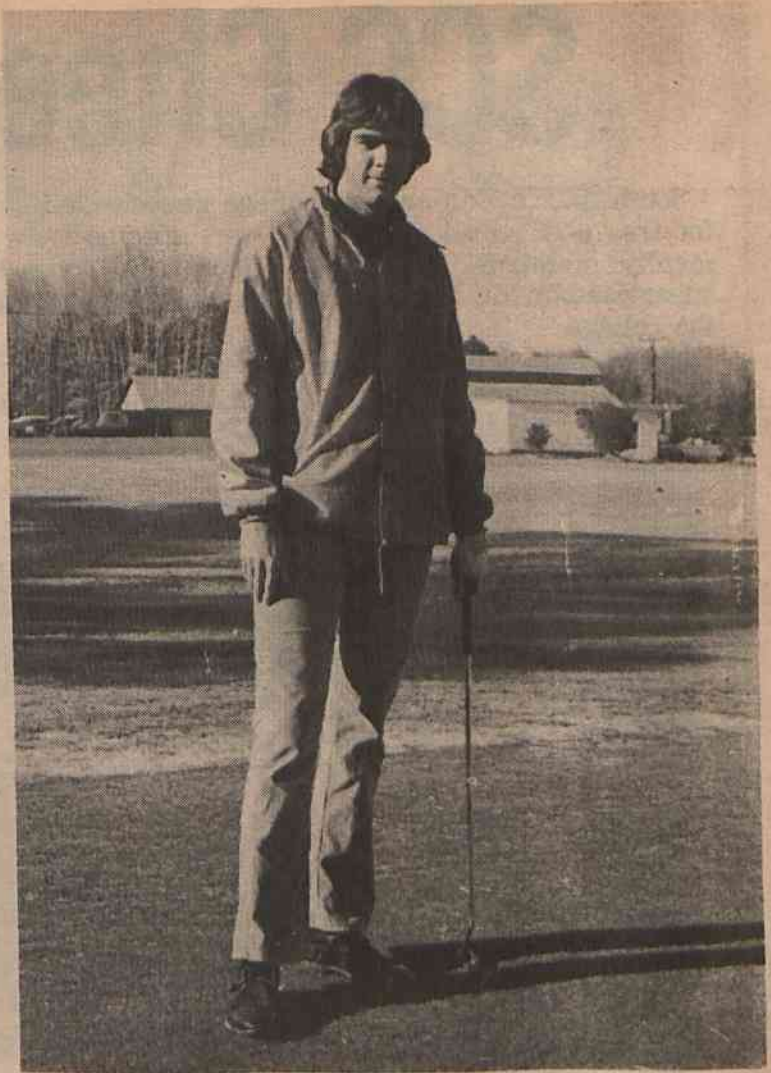
