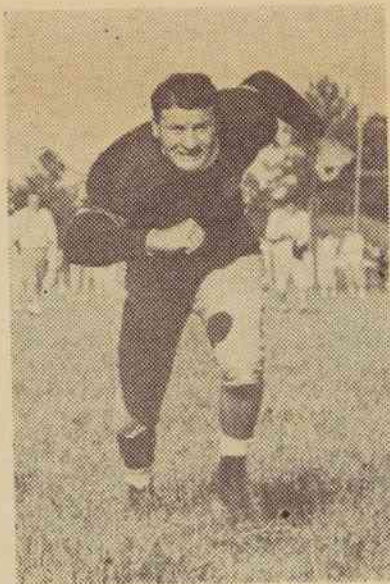
Cheerleaders Announce New Team Yells

Coach Mallory Makes Changes In Starting Line-up

Our Fighting Christians open their bid for conference recognition tomorrow night when they play host to Atlantic Christian under the lights at the College Park.

PEP RALLY TONIGHT AT 6:30

A mammoth pep rally has been called for 6:30 tonight with students slated to rally in front of West Dormitory to rehearse tomorrow night's support of Elon against Atlantic Christian.

Head Cheerleader Carl Coley will lead an emergency squad of seven temporary cheerleaders in tomorrow's shenanigans.

They are: Misses Jeanne Pittman, Jane Transon, Betsy Melson, Laila Wilkins, Delores Willis; and "Chips" Chabalko and Alton Godwin.

According to Coley, tryouts for official 1948 cheerleaders are to be held every night this week with Coley and Miss Cecile Hope Pate, girls' physical education director, instructing.

The bitter rivals enter the tussle in almost the same situation—that is, both were well pasted in their respective season openers last week. The Bulldogs lost their conference opener to the Catawba Indians, defending conference champs, by a score of 42-7, while Elon was dropping its inaugural to Davidson, 25-0.

The Davidson tussle is a thing of the past, and after this brief recap, we should forget it.

The bigger and more powerful Wildcats proved that we had no pass defense to speak of. Our blocking was worse than poor, while that big defensive line, in which Co-Cap Manzi is the smallest character, was much too slow for the wide sweep around end.

In fact, our forward wall was out-charged and out-played throughout the game, a very disheartening fact when you remember that the defensive play of the line has been the key feature of the team for the past two years.

These mistakes were very obvious and to be expected. However, there were a few bright spots in that dismal night. Fred Claytor looked so good in the few times he lugged the ball that Coach Mallory has decided to give him a crack at the fullback slot, the position he may run from tomorrow. If so, he will be alternating with Pete Marshburn.

Jack Spivey and Bill Barger, a couple of lightning-like freshmen tailbacks, will go with proper blocking. Joe Erickson could provide that, but the Wake Forest transferee is ineligible for conference competition.

Two more freshmen, Rolly Ellis and Dick Buchanan, stood out on the line. In fact, Buchanan has showed up so well at the center slot, both on defense and offense, that Coach Mallory has decided to give Paul Causey, varsity center for the past two years, a crack at the pesky blocking back post. Hank DeSimone, who has been working at that position thus far in this campaign, has gone back to his old guard post.

Outcome? The Fighting Christians took the measure of the Bulldogs by a 13-7 count last year, so we of the sports department will string along with dear ol' Elon by two touchdowns.

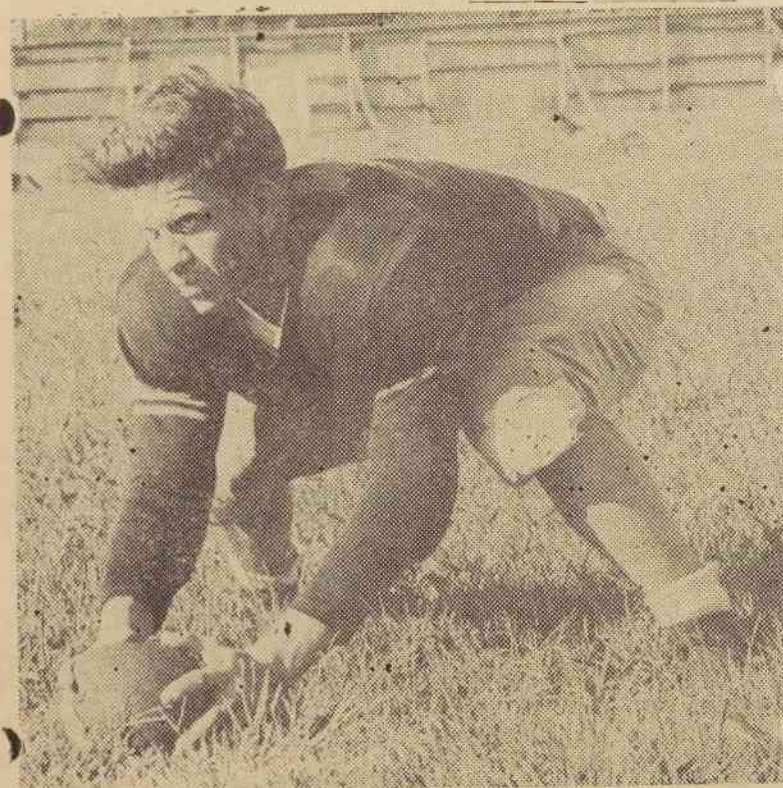

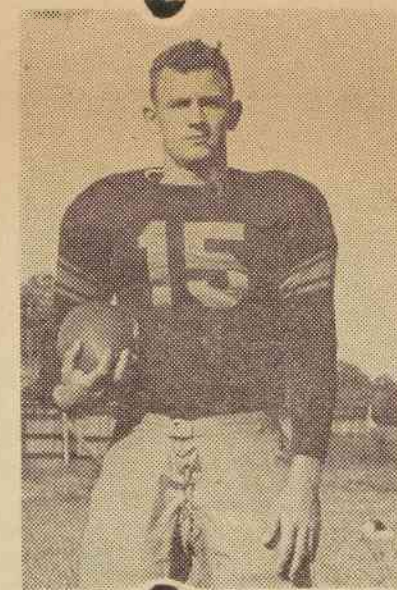
