
Elon Meets East Carolina In Important Contests

The fact that Christian cinder stars own exactly half the Conference records is quite remarkable in view of the team records, which disclose that Elon has won only one championship since the Conference meet was originated in the spring of 1950. The Christians were second in team scoring in first in 1951 and third in 1952, 1953 and 1954. Such could indicate that Elon has had a few individual stars but lacked balance for team strength.


