Whatever happened, when the fog had risen slightly in the late stages of the battle, the records disclosed that a newly aroused crew of East Carolina Pirate; had risen in unexpected strength and struck down Elon's Christians by 24.8 a 19 to 7 margin in a North State Conference football game.

The result was that Elon found herself dropped in unceremonious fashion from her first-place tie in the North State race into a tie with the victorious Pirates for third place in the league, each with one win and one defeat. The Catawha Indians were still in first place with two wins, with Lenoir Rhyne's power-laden Bears second with a single win.

Presbyterian Is Elon Grid Foe For This Week


