The program was skillfully constructed to encompass a wide variety of choral literature, including unaccompanied music from the Renaissance, selections from the Russian liturgy, early American hymn tunes and folk songs, Negro spirituals. Broadway show music and numbers composed in contemporary dissonant style. But even more important, it was performed with artistry, precision and vitality that many professional groups might envy.
