# Link Speaks On Campus March 13th

Dr. Arthur S. Link, professor of history at Princeton University and widely recognized as an outstanding writer of history, spoke in Elon's Whitley Auditorium on Friday morning, March 13th, appearing under the Visiting Scholars program of the Piedmont University Center of North Carolina.


The guest speaker, who has gained international recognition for his authoritative writings on Woodrow Wilson and the recent period in American history, spoke on the topic of "On Writing Contemporary History: Challenges and Opportunities." After the chapel convocation in Whitley Auditorium, Dr. Link met with students and faculty in an informal discussion session in Mooney Chapel. He was also guest at a luncheon meeting in McEwen Dining Hall.

Dr. Link, who is a native of Virginia and a graduate of the University of North Carolina, served as Harmsworth Professor of American History at Oxford University in England in 1958 and 1959. He has published a number of volumes on the life and works of Woodrow Wilson and is editing the Wilson pap-

The Visiting Scholars Program, under which Dr. Link came to Elon, is a cooperative effort by sixteen North Carolina colleges, designed to bring outstanding speakers to the campuses of the member institutions. Already a number of great scholars have lectured at Elon this

The North Carolina colleges cooperating in the program include A. and T., Belmont Abbey, Bennett, Catawba, Davidson, Elon, Greensboro, Guilford, High Point, Johnson C. Smith, Lenoir Rhyne, Livingstone, Pfeiffer, Salem, Wake Forest and Winston-Salem Teachers College. The head of the organization is Dr. A. R. Keppel, former president of Catawba College
