Concert Set For Whitley Stage Next Thursday Night

The Elon College-Community Orchestra, under the direction of Dr. Malvin N. Artley, who is professor of stringed music on the Elon faculty, will present its annual spring concert in Whitley Auditorium at 8 o'clock next Monday night.

The concert on Monday night climaxes the sixth successful season for the College-Community musical group, which was formed in the autumn of 1963 through the joint effort of Dr. Artley and Prof. Fletcher Moore, chairman of the Elon music department and academic dean of the college.

The orchestra is a joint campus and community effort, with musicians from the Elon faculty and student body and also from the Burlington community area. It includes musicians of all ages, the only requirement being an interest in orchestral music.

The program for next Monday night's program, announced by Dr. Artley, who will have George Cannon as a guest conductor for the concert, will feature "L'Italiana In Algeri," by Rossini and

Also listed are Floyd Hinshaw, of Snow Camp, and Charles McLendon, of Charlotte, also doubly cast as Guglielmo; Jack Cotten, of Fuquay-Varina, as Ferrando; and Robert Gwaltney, who is the registrar for the college, as Don Alfonso.

Mrs. Cofield, in commenting on the tryouts, expressed pleasure that

The modern trend for bands has been to play some of the works of Vaclav Nelbybel, and the concert group will interpret one of his percus-

sive works called "Taittico;" and by way of contrast the audience will hear some Negro spirituals in "River Jordan," by Maurice C. Whitney. The program will also be enlivened by Morton Gould's "Jericho."

The band will also play John Cacavas' "Burnished Brass," which has emerged as a full-scale concert piece rather than
