Football Coach Is **Elon Grad**

Elon College coaching staff has a new face this year. Coach Clayton Johnson is as-suming duties as backfield coach for the Fighting Christians, and is well qualified to assume the responsibilities.

Coach Johnson was graduated from Elon Col-lege in 1965 with a degree in Physical Education. He played half-back for four years of var-sity football and also was on the track team. Besides being the backfield coach, Coach Johnson teaches in the physical education department, mainly health and community hygiene.

According to Coach Johnson, the brand of football has not changed much since he played in college, with only minor changes in the official rules of the game. In a comparison of players ability of previous years and today's, Coach John-son stated, 'Players of previous year's were somewhat larger and meaner, since stress was placed on the running game more than in modern football.
