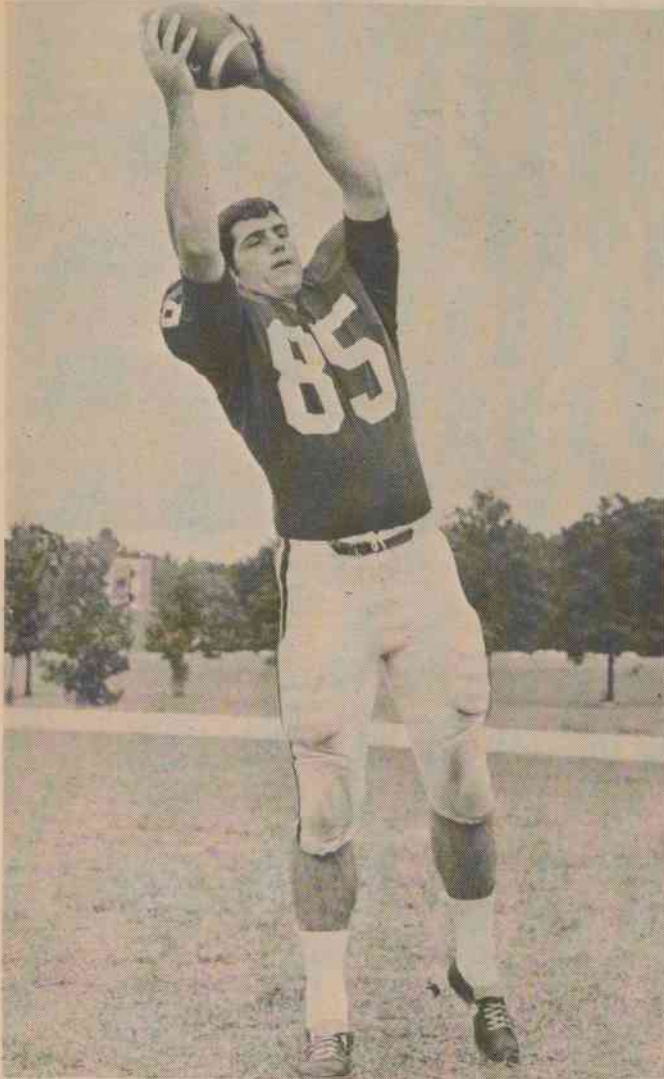


Elon Travels to Lenoir Rhyne

The main objective for intramurals, as told by Coach Drake, "is to have a program for all students to have constructive and supervised physical activity after classes."

The intramural program will have basically the same league alignment for basketball, volleyball, and softball as it had for the football session. There will be two men leagues - fraternity and dormitory.

Coach Drake described the fraternity league as "the strongest in many years and showed excellent." The fraternity league ended in a three-way tie between TKE, EPB, and the Independents. A play-off game will be necessary to decide what two fraternity teams will meet Carolina A and Smith B in the campus championship game.

The intramural league has adopted the following point system for all major activities - tag football, basketball, and softball. Entrance: 50 points, achievement 100, place 10-7-5-3 and campus champion 20. To determine the number of achievement points won, divide the total number of points for achievement in the particular category by the number of games won by the number one team.

Trophies will be awarded for team champions and point standing champions at the end of the school year.
