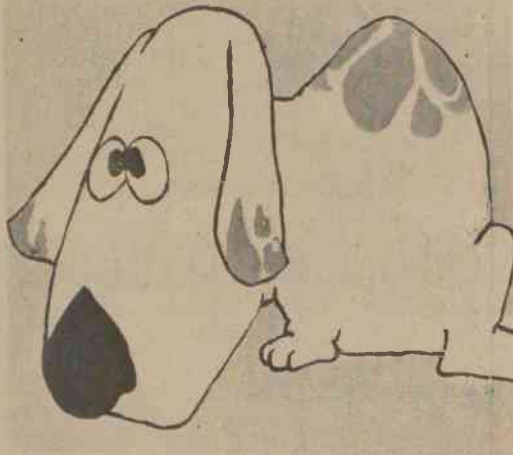


Bill Comninaki wraps up the job.

Looking For A Job? Visit This Office

When I first entered the Placement Office in Alamance Building I had to step aside to allow two men to pass. I greeted the work-a-day lady who was arranging things upon her desk and asked her to tell me about the function of her office.

After reassuring her that despite my attire I most certainly was not working for that "other" paper, she told me that the two men who had just left were from the United Accounting Service and were interviewing students for possible jobs after graduation. That was the function of this office.

"One way we reach the students is through the 'Placement News,'" she said. This informs students when personnel managers and representatives from business and industry are holding interviews on campus. "This pamphlet is distributed monthly to the seniors... Sometimes they'll talk to juniors, but it's mostly the seniors they're interested in," she said.

The door opened and we were interrupted by an inquisitive student. "Mrs. Danieleley," he stammered, "I was wondering if the student paychecks are ready yet." She opened her drawer, thumbed through a stack of checks, and handed one

to the boy, who immediately clicked his heels and disappeared through the door.

In addition to aiding students in securing permanent jobs, this office is also concerned with financial aid. It secures work for students at various strategic locations on campus, such as the labs, the cafeteria, the library, and some of the administrative offices. Students must fill out an application and return to the office before they can be placed in any capacity.

She also told me that oftentimes a business will call the school and offer jobs to students. The Placement Office places the information on the bulletin board in the wing of Alamance. The remainder of the task is left to the student. I appreciate the people in the community cooperating with us by letting us know about these jobs," she commented. I thanked her for the information, said goodbye, and proceeded to dine.

As I walked down the corridor, for the first time in my three years at Elon I noticed that crowded bulletin board and stopped to ponder the array of job offerings. The one that caught my eye was an urgent plea for someone to play Santa Claus at Holly Hill Mall. I chuckled and resumed my journey.
