
Williams Gets Four Hits: Five RBI's

Elon opened the scoring in the top of the first inning, by scoring two runs off the "Bears" pitcher, Lanny Stewart. Ron Brown singled and scored on a triple by Joe Rinaca. Jim Friesinger also hit safely, allowing Rinaca to score from third.

Capps, once again, turned in a superb pitching performance. He only allowed three hits and the first hit against him did not come until the sixth inning. Dewey struck out six batters and allowed four batters to reach first on walks.


Elon Downs Bears 13-0
