

Elon goes 4-0 with victory over L-R Bears

Tailback Dwayne Clark's five yard run in the fourth quarter gave Elon the lead, and the Christian defense held to give Elon a 28-21 victory over the Lenoir-Rhyne Bears.

The win boosts the Christians record to 4-0 overall, and 2-0 in the Carolinas Conference.

The Christians will have the week off before taking on Presbyterian in the annual Hall of Fame game in two weeks.

The home-standing Bears jumped on the board first as they returned the opening kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown.

The Christians marched right back as Craig Taylor (in tight end Chuck Ward from 11 yards out) to tie the score. Elon then grabbed the lead when freshman Chris Holley scored from four yards out.

Lenoir-Rhyne tied it again, but with 35 seconds left in the half Clark took from five yards and the Christians went into the half ahead.

The Bears tied the score at 21 in the third quarter when Sam Oct., who earlier returned the opening kickoff, scored from four yards out.

Clark's final score was when L-R quarterback Donde Bryson fumbled at the Elon 10. The Christians then made yards for the winning touch.

NOTES: Linebacker Tony Taylor collected five quarterback sacks.... Taylor was 15-of-24 passing for 221 yards.... Jim Morris led the receiving corps with five catches for 41 yards.
