Music department holds first recital

Hogan, Linnertz make beautiful music together

Faculty member Charles Hogan, piano, performed with Elizabeth Linnertz, soprano, on Tuesday night in Whitley Auditorium. It was Elon's first cultural event of the year and was presented by the University's music department.

Linnertz, of Durham, N.C., performed pieces by Rachmaninoff, Donaudy, Poulenc, Granados, and Britten. Hogan, an adjunct music professor at Elon, played the piano masterfully in accompaniment to Linnertz's singing.

The first half of the recital was dedicated to the performance of pieces writ-

ten by French artists Stephano Donaudy, Francis Poulenc and Enrique Granados. A program of notes and translations distributed at the start of the recital made it possible to follow along with the singing in both English and French.

Linnertz's clear soprano voice on the French pieces paired with Hogan's piano playing created an interesting harmony because of the fast-paced piano playing and equally intense singing. In particular, the performance of "Quelle aventure" during the first section of the recital made an impression due to the staccato rhythm of the piece.

The second portion of the recital was performed in

English and included pieces by Benjamin Britten and Sergei Rachmaninoff. Hogan's piano playing on "The Harvest of Sorrow", and Linnertz's accompaniment was notable, as the two created a melancholy atmosphere.

One of the highlights of the performance was "La Reine de Coeur," or "The

Queen of Hearts," in which Hogan's slow and melodious piano playing was a change from the fast-paced playing of the previous pieces.

The recital was an invigorating beginning to the fall music season.
