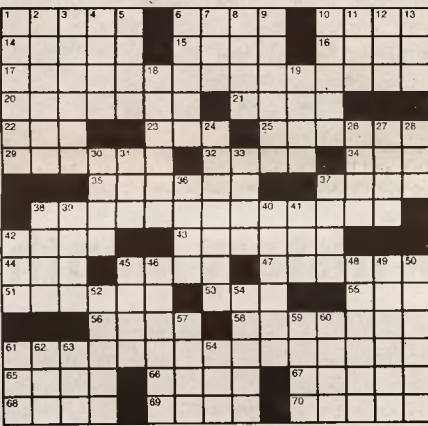
The estimated value of damage is \$300.
