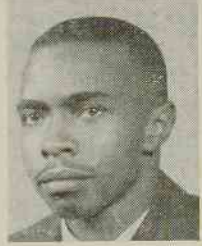


Johnny Butler Says . . .

HONORS IN FOOTBALL

The idea of selecting a mythical All-America football team is American in origin. It goes back to 1889 when Grantland Rice assisted by a staff of 440 paid helpers, chose the first All-America team. The idea has persisted. The 1948 season saw the appearance of six All-America football teams, and from the group **Scholastic Magazine** for January 5, 1949 chose what it called a "super-All-America team." Negro colleges have fallen in line and today we have a Negro All-America selection, an All-C. I. A. A. selection, and son on through the list.

On the 1948 All-E. I. A. C. first team appears the names of four Fayetteville Broncos. The names of three others were placed on the second team.
