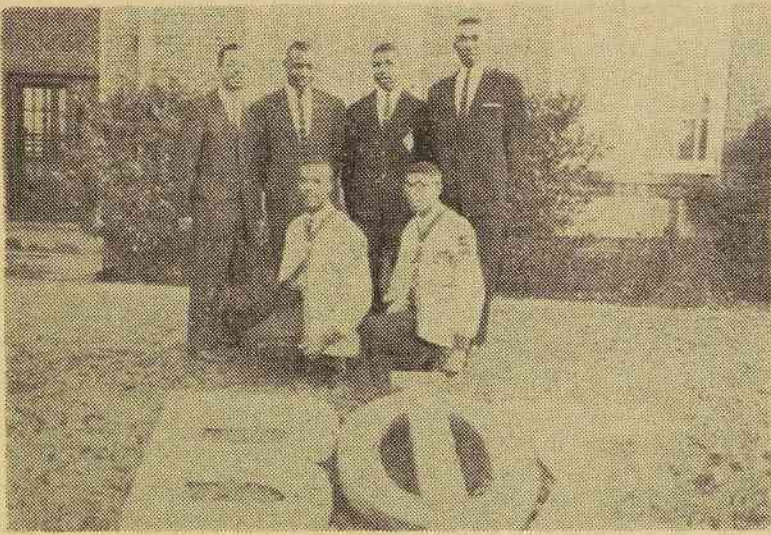


WITH THE GREEKS

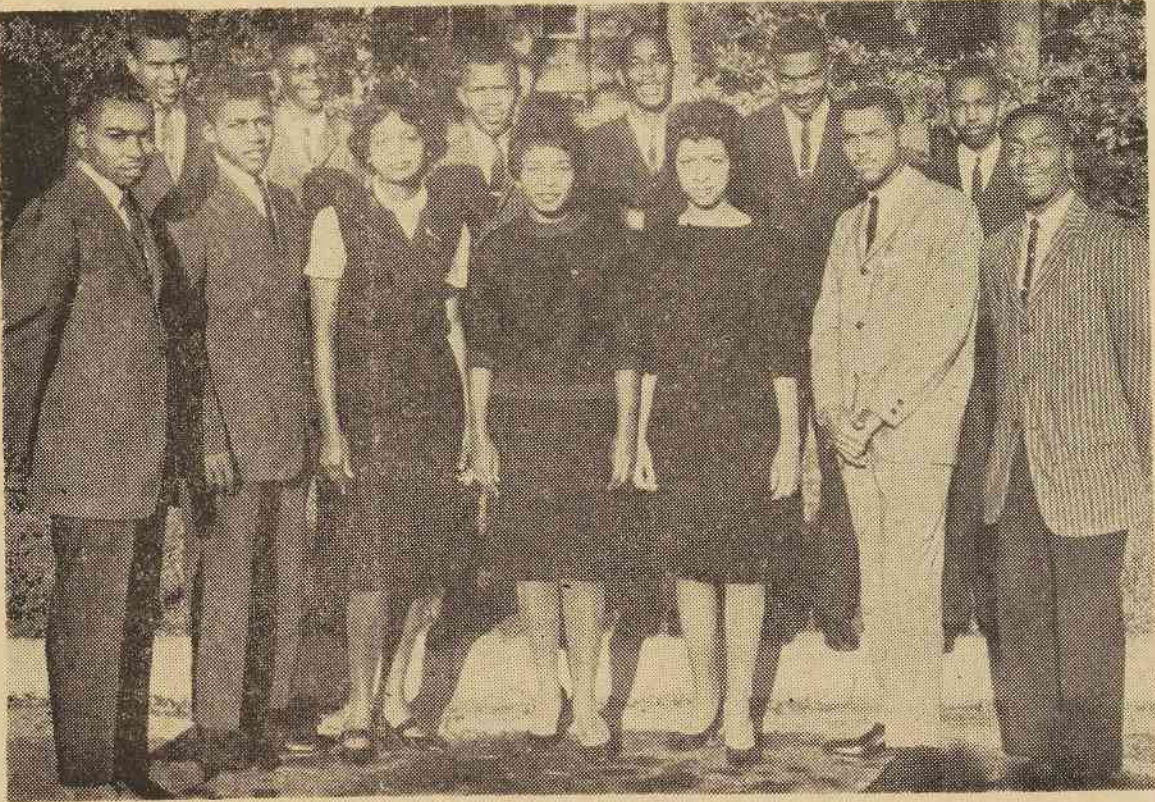

Miss Means, along with 85 other Alpha Kappa Alpha Women, made a culture-pleasure tour of ten European and five African countries during the past summer. England, Holland, Belgium, France, Monaco, Italy, Switzerland, Austria, Germany and Spain in Europe, and Senegal, Liberia, Ghana, Nigeria and Morocco in Africa were the countries visited.

Leaving New York's Idlewild Airport by TWA Jet on July 24, the group traveled from the "Folies Bergere" to the "Passion

Play" of Oberammergau, they saw the high peaks of the Alps, snow-covered in August, they felt the warm sunshine of the French and Italian Riviera, they took in the Shakespeare Excursion in Stratford, and saw the bullfights in Madrid. The high point of the trip, according to Miss Means, was the International Regional Conference of the AKA Sorority held in Liberia, where 38 sorors of the Africa group graciously entertained. The host group was composed of women from 20 different states in continental United States.
