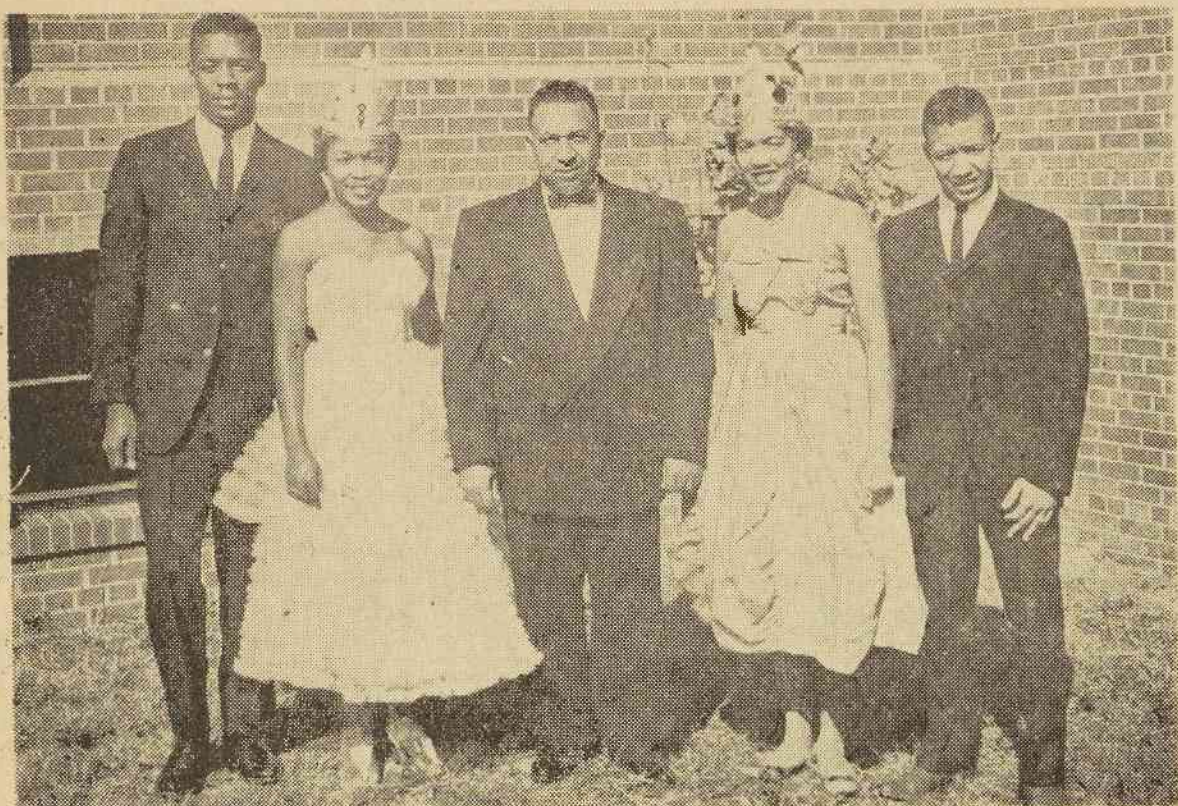

This year, we are planning to go on tours in state and out of state. We are working very diligently in preparing for Vesper programs and our annual Christmas program, which will be December 4, 1960.

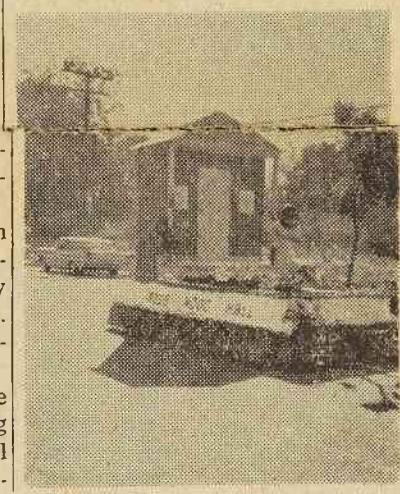
After our regular rehearsal on October 31, we had a get-acquainted party. It was enjoyed by all the members who attended. There was lots of fun for everyone.
