

Faculty Additions

Fayetteville State College added 19 new members to its faculty in preparation for a student enrollment of 1,177 this year, largest in the college's 89-year history.

Four of the new teachers have earned their doctorates, giving Fayetteville State 20 faculty members with doctor's degrees from a total of 73, an unusually large proportion for a college of its size.

Dr. Rudolph Jones, president of the college, announced the following new faculty appointments:

HISTORY:

Mr. Lorenzo Battle, with a bachelor's degree from North Carolina College at Durham, and a master's degree from Columbia University; Mr. David W. Dotson, with a bachelor's degree from Columbia College, and a master's degree from Columbia University; Miss Wilma King, a Bachelor of Arts degree from Jackson State College and a master's degree from Indiana University; and Miss Ann M. Shoub, a bachelor's degree from the College of New Rochelle and a master's degree from Catholic University of America.

Dr. Theodore F. Boushy, who teaches History and Political Science, holds a bachelor's degree, a master's degree and a doctorate from the University of Oklahoma, and a Bachelor of Divinity degree from Southern Baptist Seminary.

EDUCATION:

Mr. Charles I. Brown, who holds a bachelor's degree from Fayetteville State College, a master's degree from North Carolina College at Durham, and an education degree from the State University of Rutgers; and Mr. Jasper Turner, with a bachelor's degree from Boston University.

BIOLOGY:

Mr. Charles R. George, with a Bachelor of Science degree from N. C. Agricultural and Technical College, and a master's degree from Oklahoma State University; and Dr. Frissell R. Hunter, with a bachelor's degree from Virginia Union University, a master's degree from Howard University, and a doctorate from the State University of Iowa.

Mrs. Natalie Williams, with a bachelor's degree from Hampton Institute and a Master of Arts and Teaching from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, joined the English Department last spring.

Teaching psychology is Dr. Grady Davis, with a Bachelor of Arts degree from Shaw University, a Bachelor of Divinity degree from Andover-Newton Theological School and Doctor of Philosophy degree from Boston University.

Physical Education: Dr. Jack Davis, with a bachelor's degree from Livingstone State Teachers College, a master's degree from the University of Iowa, and a doctorate in education from the University of Oregon.

Mr. Gershon B. Fiawoo, who teaches English, earned his Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Divinity degrees from Johnson C. Smith University, his Master of Arts degree from North Carolina College at Durham, and his Master of Theology degree from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary. Mrs. Helen S. Davis, with a bachelor's degree from Utah State University; Mr. Zeral W. Mallard, B. A. degree from Atlantic Christian College and M. A. from Trinity University.

Mrs. Beulah G. M. Monroe, in business education, received her bachelor's degree from the North Carolina Agricultural and Technical College and her master's degree from North Carolina College at Durham.

Mr. Kanti Patel, teacher of mathematics, earned his Bachelor of

Science, Master of Science, and Bachelor of Arts degrees from Gujarat University in India, and holds a master's degree from Duke University.

Dr. Irving S. Cheroff, teacher of sociology, was appointed publicity and public relations director.
