## N.T.E.Changes

The Juniors and Seniors should be especially interested in the two important changes that will be found in the National Teacher Examination this year. These changes are:

1. Content and length of NTE tests
2. Administration dates

To shorten the test, the three tests of professional Education (psychological Foundations of Educational, Social Foundations of Education and Teaching Principal and Practices) will be combined into a one 90 minute Professional Education Test. This will yield a two-digit score of the overall achievements in this field. This new Professional Education Test will carry the same weight in computing the Weighted Common Examination Total Score, (39 points).

The afternoon NTE Test will be devoted solely to the administration of Teaching Area Examination; this will take 120 minutes.

Testing dates are; January 3, 1968, April 6, 1968 and July 6, 1968. A fee of three dollars will have to be paid for late registration forms.

## PRESIDENT SIGNS NEW VETERANS' LAW

The President has signed into law "The Veterans Pension and Readjustment Assistance Act of 1967." This new legislation was enacted by the Congress in response to the President's request of last January. It strengthens and extends the system of benefits offered to those who have served their country.

The Act provides substantial improvement in many instances of benefit and treatment. It also extends special recognition to those who have served in Viet Nam.

A brief summary of the important features of the new Law follows:

Rate changes are effective October 1 and payable not earlier than November 1. If your monthly benefit rate is affected, the change will be done automatically and you need not write VA. Viet Nam Era:

Full wartime benefits for all veterans with Service after August 4, 1964. Wartime rates for disability incurred after that test you may see Dr. Pace.

Education:

\*Increased rates for all GI Bill students.

\*New On-The-Job, apprenticeship, farm cooperative and flight training programs.

\*Additional allowance for multiple dependents--a claim is required if you have more than two dependents.

Automobile Allowance:

\*Up to \$1,600 for certain veterans who lost a limb or suffered blindness after January 31, 1955. All time limits for filing claims are removed--claim is required. World War II and Korean veterans previously denied because they did not file timely claims should reapply.

Drugs and Medicines:

\*A veteran being paid a special rate of compensation or pension because of the need for Aid and Attendance of another person may obtain from the VA drugs and medicines prescribed by his physician.

## "CATCH UP" MONEY

The so-called "catch-up" money for the predominantly Negro colleges which was appropriated by the 1967 General Assembly has been allocated by the State Board of Higher Education.

The total for the biennium is one million dollars. Of this amount \$350,000 is available this year and \$650,000 next year. The five State institutions have received funds as follows:

North Carolina A & T State Univ.	\$ 88,228
North Carolina College at Durham	93,048
Elizabeth City State College	56,321
Fayetteville State College	58,858
Winston-Salem State College	53,545
Total	\$350,000

Among the items included for Fayetteville State College are the following:

- Full time Dean of Women
- Admissions Officer
- Coordinator of Learning Laboratory
- Two Assistants for the Learning Laboratory
- Two persons to help get books on shelves in Library

Funds have also been made available for the following purposes:

- Faculty recruitment
- Student recruitment
- Programmed materials to set up temporary Learning Laboratory
- Library books for secondary major subjects
