### BEST TEAM

Fayetteville State was the best hitting team in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), according to statistics released by the NAIA Service Bureau.

Coach Milton Armstead's charges clubbed the horsehide at a .389 clip in 21-games during the past baseball season. The Bronco team had three batters with over .400 hitting averages and they included Ronnie Battle, Larry Faulk, and Roger Floyd.

Fayetteville State also had the best earned run average with a 1.43 mark in 21 games. Earl McNeil was the leading pitcher with eight victories and a no-hitter to his credit.

### TIED

Alphana Hobbs, FSU catcher, tied for the NAIA lead in the number of triples with six. Roger Floyd was close behind with six.
