Fayetteville - Swish! Swish! Swish! Is it Alton Cogdell? Is it Larry Cogdell? These two players are presently bringing a lot of "Oohs" and "Aahs" from Bronco followers around the CIAA with their spectacular plays and play-making.

Coach Thomas Reeves, skipper of the talent-laden Fayetteville State University Bronco basketball squad has a brothercombination this year which is proving to be a devastating force on the hardwood.

Everone in the CIAA is quite familiar with number twentyone of the Reeves-men. He is All-CIAA candidate Alton Goddell, a sure-handed shooter rebounder, and cat-like ballhandler, who is averaging 22.5 points a game and 9.6 rebound per contest. However, another Cogdell, Larry to be exact, has emerged on the Bronco cage

scene which is giving coach Reeves double dynamite material on the hardwood.

Alton, the younger brother, plays forward while his big brother Larry holds down the pivot-spot.

Larry, a 6-6 220 pounder who wears number fifty one for the Bronco-men, started playing in the second semester at FSU and has been nothing short of sensational. Both of the brothers are products of nearby Saint Pauls, North Carolina, and played their high school ball at Eastside High School.

In nine games for the Reevesmen, Larry Cogdell has poured in a total of 82 points and grabbed 72 big rebounds. At this point, older brother Larry is averaging eight rebounds agame and has a 9.1 scoring average. Little brother Alton is not doing In a super too bad either.

individual effort against Elizabeth City State University, Alton tossed in a season-high of 40 points while pulling down 19 rebounds.

In 19 games for the Broncos this campaign, Alton has .722 field goal percentage mark. The classy 6-4, 190 pound forward has pulled down 183 rebounds, bucketed 429 points for a 22.5 game average.

Alton has also been selected as the "Player-of-the-Week" in District 29 of the NAIA during December.

The Broncos, coached by Thomas L. Reeves, have not lost a single contest since starting the second half of the hardwood



In fact, the Fayetteville University presently stands 7-2 in the CIAA right behind the Winston-Salem State University Rams in the Southern Division of the league. Overall, the Reeves-men are currently sporting an 11-5 worksheet overall.

Since the New Year began, the Fayetteville State University pressive fashion. The Reeves-men have defeated Virginia State College, Livingstone College, Saint Paul's College and Shaw University. The Bronco basketeers have conquered Livingstone College and Shaw University both at home and away. In their latest 97-80 victory over the Shaw University Bears, All-CIAA contender Alton Cogdell poured in 24 points and continues to average over 20 points per contest for FSU. The 6-4, 195 pound St. Paul's North Carolina native "can-do-it-all" according to the skipper of Broncos, Thomas Reeves. "Cogdell is very effective and tough in a one-on-one sit-uation," said the FSU skipper, "and he moves the ball extremely well plus he is an excellent rebounder and shooter," Reeves said.

Having defeated the Shaw University Bears earlier this season by two points at Raleigh, "I thought it would be a lot closer," smiled the genial boss of the Broncos. "All of the kids are hungry to play good ball and I believe we will play this way throughout this season," said the likeable Reeves.

Although the Broncos have a winning team, the squad has many versatile players. Junior guard James Tyus who hit 18 points against Shaw is very deadly outside shooter and rebounder. Forward Roy Birch and Terrance Murchison each added 12 points. Roy Birch is very quick and has been deadly on defense. "If you are not careful, Birch will steal the ball and have it in the basket before the opponent knows what is happening," smiled Reeves. Terrance Murchison, a 6-6 forward pivotman, has proved to be a very clutch rebounder and shooter and is averaging over 12 rebounds per game.

Last year Coach Reeves was runner-up in the CIAA Tourney and voted "Outstanding Tourney CIAA Coach." This year the FSU skipper says that he "wants to take the whole thing."
