The 32-year old Baltimore, Maryland native is a 1965 graduate of the

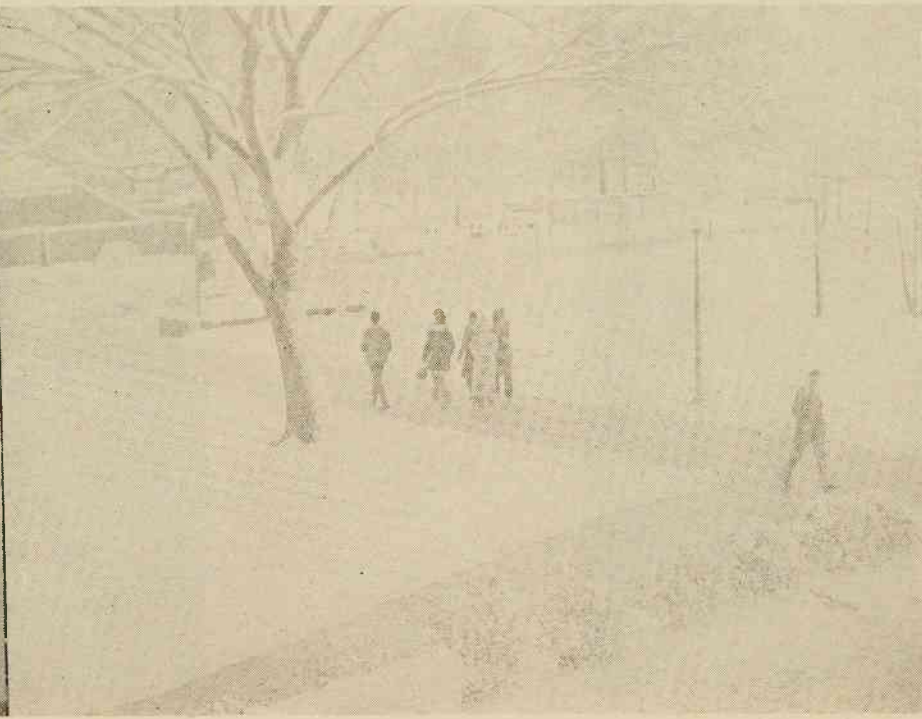
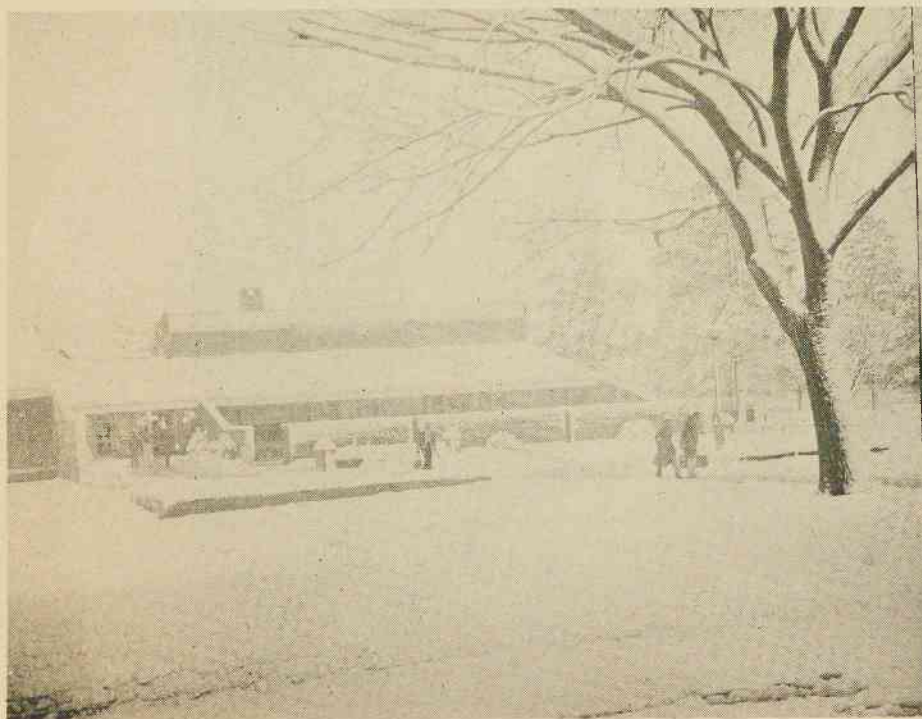
