year in the CIAA tournament falling to St. Augustine's College, 56-54, at Petersburg, Virginia.

Miss Taylor has been at FSU 32 years and done undergraduate work at A&T State University. She received the M.A. degree at Columbia University with further study at Yale University and the University of Pittsburgh.

A native of Wilson, North Carolina, the Broncoettes hope that the "Brain of Basketball" will be around a long, long time to come.
