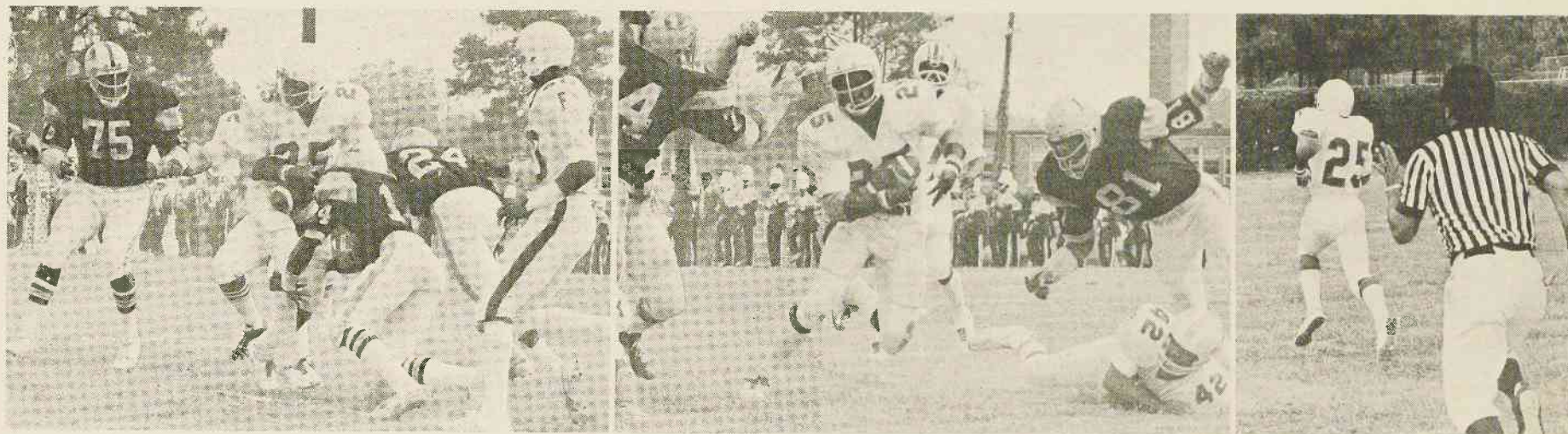

Godwin has excelled in track while at FSU and is an All-American. He has been clocked in 40 yard dash at 4.4 and holds several track meets marks in the high jump event.

Named to the All-CIAA conference in '74 and '75, Godwin received high praise by his coach, Ray McDougal.

"Godwin is very coachable," said the Bronco mentor, "and he is a team oriented individual who is quick, strong, versatile, and a very good blocker."

Walter Johnson, the highly regarded track coach at FSU, feels just as keenly about his pupil.

"James is quite a natural athlete. You have to be to participate in two sports at a school such as track and football which require a great deal of stamina."
