### Momma's Pound Cake

- 1/2 lb. Butter (2 cups)
- 1/2 lb. Sugar (2 cups)
- 5 Eggs (unbeaten)
- 1/2 lb. Sifted Flour
- 1/4 Tsp. Salt
- 1/2 Cup Milk
- 1 Tsp. Lemon Juice or Extract

Beat butter until creamy; add sugar.  
Beat until light. Beat eggs in one at a  
time. Add sifted flour and salt  
alternately with milk and extract. Line  
loaf pan, bottom and sides, with wax  
paper or dampen with shortening and  
flour. Pour batter in, bake in slow oven,  
300 F., for 1 1/2 hours. Cover cake with  
cardboard for the first hour of cooking.  
When cake is done. Remove from pan  
and place on serving rack. Serve cool or  
warm.
