

## Three FSU Players Named To All-CIAA Cage Squads

For the first time in over a decade, three basketball players from Fayetteville State University were named to the coaches' All Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) basketball squads for the 1984-85 campaign.

Annetta Faulcon, 5-10 junior co-captain and shooting forward from Littleton, North Carolina, was named to the Women's All-CIAA team, while Edward James, a junior forward, and Travis Adams, also a junior swing guard, were named to the All-CIAA men's squad.

Faulcon, who was named to All-Tournament teams twice during the regular season for outstanding play (Washington, D.C. and Frances Marion Invitationals) and named CIAA "Player-of-the-Week" twice for superior performances, averaged 21 points for the season. She was second to

teammate Lisa Green's 11.0 rebounds per contest with a 9.5 average. Faulcon also led in free throw percentage shooting .857 from the line while dishing out a team leading 4.1 assists per outing.

Edward James, 609 junior from Society Hill, S.C. who sat out the first half of the campaign, was second in scoring for the Bronco-men with a 17.0 average and a team-leading 12 rebounds per game.

Co-captain Travis Adams scored 21 points per game. The Morehead City, N.C. native was vital in coach Jake Ford's attack this past season and did not miss a game.

This was the first time that Faulcon, James and Adams have been selected to the All-CIAA basketball team and all three return next year.

## Faulcon Statistical Leader

Hoke County Senior High School product Annetta Faulcon contributed greatly to the Lady Bronco's success this year in basketball. In statistical data released by the CIAA (Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association) office, she was listed in five categories.

Annetta is the league's number one free-throw shooter, hitting 85.7 percent of her shots. She is

second in scoring with an average of 20.5 points per game. She has grabbed an average of 9.5 rebounds per game, placing her eighth in the league.

Faulcon also is number eight in field goal percentage with a 51.3 percent accuracy. In addition, she contributed to her teammates' scoring with 4.1 assists per game, ranking her seventh in the league in this department.

## Lady Broncos In Tournament

The fourth seeded Lady Broncos easily won their game in the opening round of the Women's CIAA Championship by defeating Virginia State University 74-61, Thursday, February 21st. Annetta Faulcon scored 23 points to pace the Lady Broncos to their 14th win of the season. Also, scoring in double figures were Sabrina Baines with 13 points while Lisa Green and Joyce Vaughn contributed 12 points each. The

Women's CIAA College Basketball Tournament was held at Norfolk State's Echols Hall Arena.

The Lady Broncos became spectators at the CIAA Tournament Friday, February 22nd, as they fell 81-60 to Hampton Institute in the second round of the women's tournament. The Lady Broncos closed out their season with a 14-14 record.

## Broncos Lose In CIAA Tournament

NORFOLK, VA--Coach Jake Ford's Bronco charges were soundly thrashed 101-81 by Bobby Vaughn's Vikings in the opening rounds of the 40th annual CIAA tournament at Norfolk's Scope Arena before approximately 3,000 fans.

The Bronco-men finish the '84-85 campaign with a 9-15 worksheet.

All-CIAA swing guard Travis Adams led the Fayetteville State University basketball club with 17 points in this losing cause. He was followed by All-CIAA forward

Edward James who canned 15 while grabbing a game-high eight rebounds for his team. Sam Nelson pulled down six boards for the FSU squad. Third in scoring was point guard Derrick Sheffield with 12. Sheffield also had seven assists.

Leading the scoring for the Vikings was All-CIAA guard Benjamin Brown with 21 points. He was followed by Jamie Turner with 20 points and nine rebounds and Kenny Hilton with 16.

Virginia Union's Panthers, the nation's top-ranked NCAA Division II team, eventually claimed the 40th

annual CIAA tournament title with a 67-65 triumph over homestanding Norfolk State University last Saturday before a sell-out crowd.

In the women's CIAA championship contest, played just before the men's final game, the Lady Pirates of Hampton Institute defeated Winston-Salem State's Lady Rams, 93-84, for that title.

The victory by Virginia's Dave Robbins marked the third time the talented coach has won the coveted CIAA title since becoming head coach at Virginia Union.
