At the start of the game, Winston-Salem won the coin toss and elected to receive the ball. On WSSU's first drive of the game, they were halted by a fired up Bronco defense, which went without the services of nose guard Otis Ransaw who was side lined because of a knee injury. The Bronco's offense came on to the field and moved the ball impressively, but was unable to come up with a first down and had to punt it away. Winston-Salem State took over and found that it was hard moving the ball up the field, and they had to punt it back to FSU at 6:35. In the first quarter, FSU began passing the ball and getting receptions from Moses Ford and Benjamin Knox. WSSU big defensive play came when Raymond Puryear intercepted a Jerome


