past. Now the administration knows how a portion of the students feel. We want the holiday.

Let's review the accomplishments of Dr. King. The Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., born in 1929, dedicated his life to winning equality for all people. Dr. King was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964 for his leadership in the Civil Rights Movement. Dr. King was assassinated in Memphis, Tennessee in 1968.

On a sadder note, in this day and age, is the fact that racism still exists. Just recently, civil rights' marchers in Georgia were met by people (I use the term loosely) who threw rocks and bottles. Some of the aggressors were reported to be members of the Ku Klux Klan. In New York black men walking in a predominantly white neighborhood were chased with bats. One of the black men, in the course of fleeing for his life, was chased into the path of an oncoming vehicle and died.
