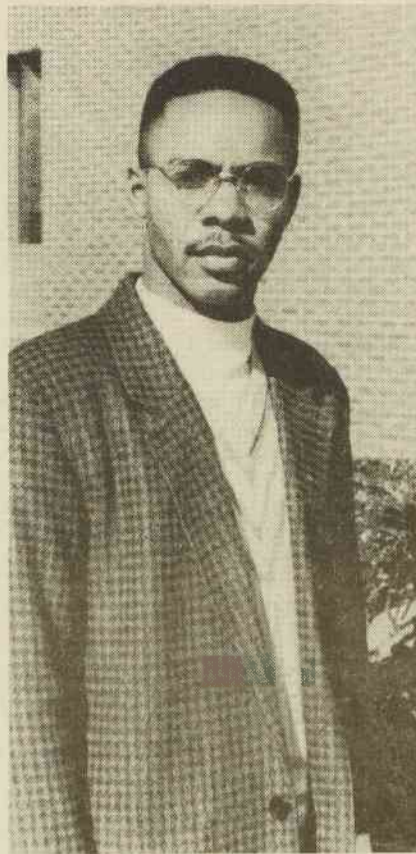


Congratulations To Rodney Barnes
