

# Fayetteville State University Broncos 1989 Football Outlook

**Fayetteville State University**  
The 1989 edition of Fayetteville State University football is filled with question marks. Head Coach Raymond McDougal returns to the helm after a 10 year absence and this season's success will depend on how well the Broncos answer some significant questions.

Last year could best be described as a major disappointment. FSU did not win a game on the field after an extraordinary 6-2-2 season in 1987. Only a forfeit by Morris Brown prevented the Broncos from completing an "o-fer" campaign. FSU chalked up a 1-6-2 record in 1988.

A few weeks following the end of the 1988 season, Head Coach Robert Pulliam announced his resignation. It seemed that things had hit rock bottom.

FSU decided to look within the ranks and selected McDougal to take over the program. Unfortunately "Coach Mac" didn't get the appointment until April and when Coach Pulliam resigned, McDougal was acting as interim coach of the Men's basketball team.

The first question to be answered is how well the team will recover from the disappointment of last year and adapt to a new coaching philosophy. Initial practices have been noticeably different from previous years as McDougal attempts to bring some fun back into the game. He emphasizes they are still selecting a team and trying to find out what they can do best. During training camp, the Broncos

are going through changes with freshmen coming in and adjusting to the new rigorous schedule. "A lot of the kids are coming in having spent a lot of time eating hamburgers and french fries over the summer and being out of shape," noted Assistant Coach Melvin Lindsey. With practice four times a day (three on the field and one in the classroom) and a little help from the elements, Assistant Coach Lindsey hopes the Bronco coaching staff will be able to get these students into shape by the time they play the first game.

If FSU has any strengths it will be on defense. The Broncos return nine defensive starters and defensive coordinator Frank Merchant anticipates using the same 50 defense which picked off 10 interceptions last season and has consistently ranked as one of the stingiest rushing defenses in the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

Anchoring the defensive line will be two year starter George Hatchell at end, Terrence Smith at nose guard, and Pre-season All-CIAA linebacker Andre Bowden is hoping that teammate and defensive captain Willie Hopkins can return to his 1987 form when he made All-CIAA and ranked nationally in pass interceptions per game. Hopkins was injured for much of last season and did not dress for the final two games. He still picked up 27 tackles and three fumble recoveries for FSU last season.

At defensive back, third leading tackler Marvin Price and fourth leading tackler Craig Sanders return to a secondary which showed much improvement over the previous season.

The major question marks for FSU will be on offense. Can often-injured Paul Stevens return to his 1987 form when he lead the team in rushing and accounted for nearly 40% of the Bronco offense? All-Rookie selected Willie Woodard turned out to be the leading passer although he only completed 25% of his attempts.

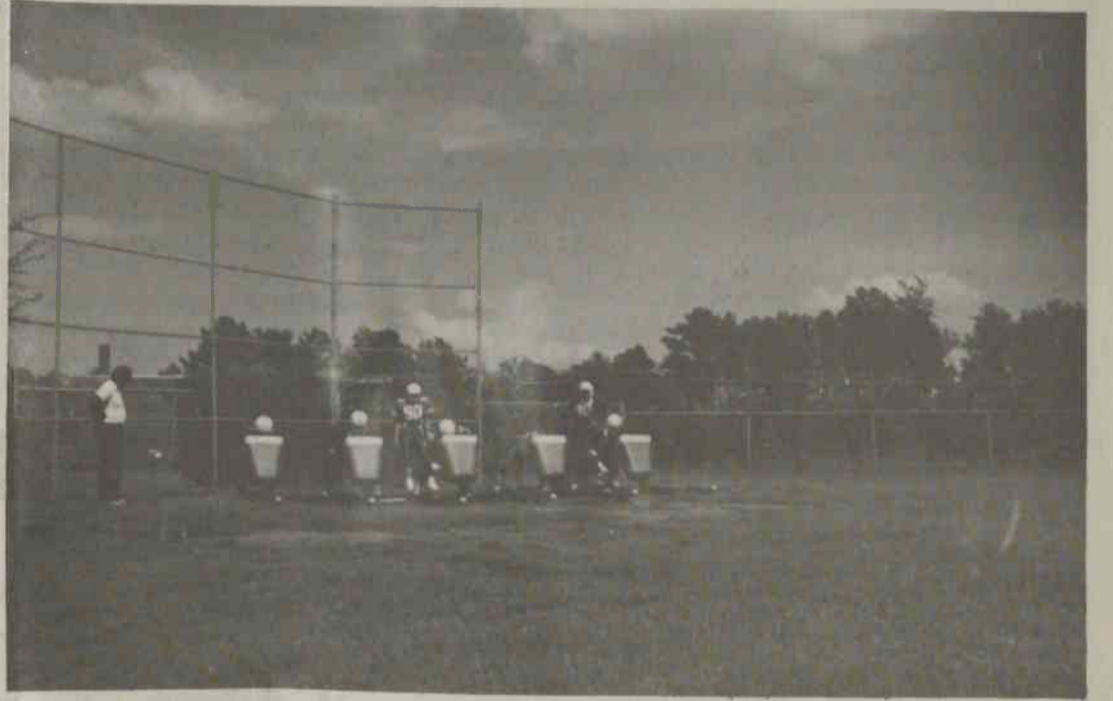
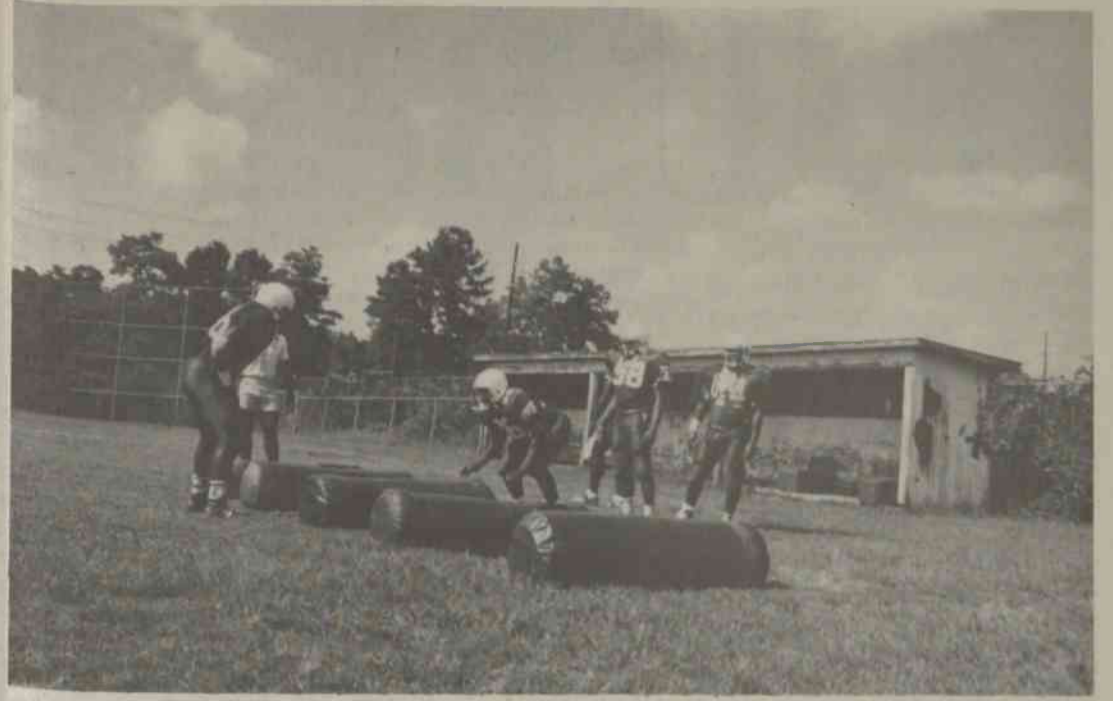
There are some bright spots. Running back Glen McFadden was the leading rusher in an anemic offense last season and had more pass receptions (9 for 86 yards) than any of his teammates. Wide receiver/kicker returner Ronnie Barnes caught 8 passes for 186 yards and a touch-down last year.

Pre-season All-CIAA pick Terrence Hall must assume a heavy load at tackle for an offensive line which lost three starters to graduation. Alexander Scott returns at center but Coach McDougal will have a lot of holes to fill on the offensive line.

The kicking game is half settled with Bowden handling field goal attempts. The Broncos are in the market for a punter and kickoff specialist.

Receivers Coach Lindsey echoed the sentiments of the coaching staff when he said he was optimistic about the upcoming season. "I think we're the underdogs on everybody's scorecard," he said. "I think it's a blessing in disguise for us."

If McDougal can work his magic formula from the past—taking players that others may have passed over and turning them into contenders - the days of the Blue Thunder and White Lightning could simply become MACTHUNDER.
