- Game 10 FSU(9) Livingstone(34)

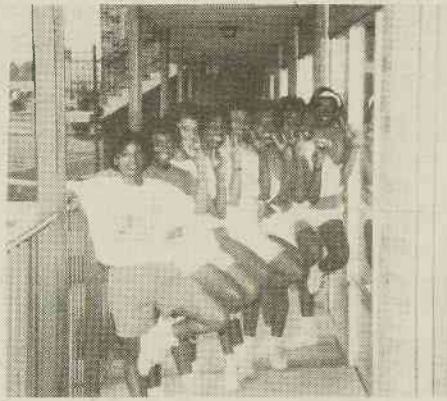

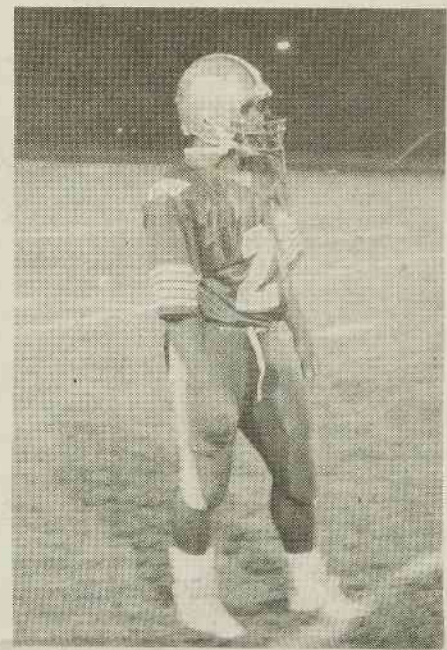
- #22-Kenneth Frazier(RB) - Best game: 117 yards, 1 TD; led CIAA in all purpose yards before injury.
