AKA'S DONATE \$250 TO HOMELESS SHELTER

The FSU chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. continued their outstanding tradition of community service by sponsoring a fundraiser to benefit an area shelter for the homeless. A "Fasting For The Homeless" drive raised \$250 to support this effort. Though the event was designed to help raise community awareness of and involvement with this important concern, a lot more was actually accomplished. Chapter President, senior Sociology major Bayyinnah McGregor, explained that many of her "sisters" experienced a spiritual awakening not only to the plight of the homeless but also to the importance of their leadership, through involvement, to make a difference.

And make a difference they did. Rev. Bill Riggs, director of Winslow House, a local shelter that provides food, shelter, and clothing to Fayetteville's needy, explained that AKA's \$250 donation couldn't have come at a better time. "We have a \$775 insurance bill due in March that this donation will go towards paying. We are a nonprofit organization and all of our operational costs are paid for by donations. We thank God for this blessing; we thank the AKA's for their concern and contribution."

AKA was the first chartered female sorority at FSU with its inception in 1952. Bayyinnah stated that she was very proud to be a member of one of the most dynamic, aggressive, and energetic organizations on FSU.
