These are the words of Chancellor-elect Willis B. McLeod. Dr. McLeod, the first alumnus to lead FSU, gradu-

ated from the institution in 1964 with a Bachelors degree in Mathematics. President of the sixteen-campus University of North Carolina, C.D.

Dr. McLeod brings to education more than thirty years of professional expertise.

UNC's Board of Governors on September 8, 1995 stating that McLeod has "displayed the imagination, energy, and passion for learning needed in a Chancellor..."

Dr. McLeod brings to education more than thirty years of professional

expertise. Presently, he serves as Superintendent of the Richland County School District One, Columbia, South Carolina. As chief administrator, he supervises the total education program for more than 26,000 students. In an informal luncheon which included Dr. Glenna Sexton, Acting Vice-chancellor for Student Affairs; Dr. Harry Ghee, Acting Vice-chancellor for Business and Finance; Wayne Hodges, SGA President; and a group of student leaders, Dr. McLeod voiced his excitement over interacting with the smaller number of students (approximately 4,000) here at Fayetteville State.
