


FSU IN THE COMMUNITY

Football and basketball are rough sports, but they would not be the same without the woman's touch. Bronco Cheerleaders have been around since the '40s. They have helped to propel Bronco teams to victory over the years. There is little available information on cheerleaders. They have been a cross section of the student body. One former cheerleader, Valery Jones, is a radio personality. Another, Dr. Vivian Fuller, is athletic director at Northeastern Illinois University, the first Black woman in the country to become athletic director of a Division I school.

After a brief period of decrease interest in cheerleading, the squad was revived by Patrice Gilliam in 1987. She was replaced in 1988 by Maceo Esquiline, and Rita Adams is the cheerleading coach today.




