

second field-goal attempt, a 39yarder with 3:18 left in the game.

That missed field goal gave the Broncos one last chance, and they took advantage this time.

Fayetteville State started on its own 22-yard line. Quarterback Te'Mon Wallace completed 8 of 9 passes on the drive, including the game-tying 7-yard touchdown pass to receiver Wayman Westbrook with 30 seconds left to play.

"We had to take what they were giving us," said wide receiver Elliott London, who had 10 catches for 88 yards and a touchdown. "We had to make the right blocks, protect the quarterback and just let the athletes make plays.

"I don't know where our heads were at in the first half, and it showed on the scoreboard."

Wallace completed 28 of 39 passes for 247 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions.

The Rams opened the first overtime with the ball, but had to settle for a 42-yard field goal by

The Broncos threatened to end things in the first overtime, driving the ball to the Winston-Salem State 3-yard line. But on fourth-and-goal, freshman kicker Justin Langdon, a South View graduate, tied the game on a 20-yarder, sending the game to the second overtime. He had made just one of eight field goals going

into Saturday's game.

The Broncos scored quickly in the second overtime. Wallace hit London for a 20-yard touchdown reception on the third play of the drive. But Fayetteville State was unable to keep the Rams out of the end zone, and they tied the game on a 1-yard touchdown run by McGee.

Both teams scored quickly in the third overtime. On the third play from scrimmage, WSSU's Vincent Wilkins scored on a 3-yard run. Fayetteville State forced a fourth overtime when Wallace connected with Daryl Bright for a 22-yard touchdown reception.

Then things got a bit more complicated.

The Broncos took a 30-24 lead when DeAngelo Bridgers scored on a 6-yard touchdown run. The tiebreaker rules mandate that teams have to go for a two-point conversion after the third overtime.

When Fayetteville State went for its two-point conversion, Wallace was intercepted in the end zone by Raymond Barksdale, who had two interceptions earlier in the game. Barksdale returned it 102 yards, which gave Winston-Salem State two points and made it a 30-26 game. "They still had to score a touchdown," defensive back Phil Crumb said. "The pressure was on them." Winston-Salem State opened the drive with a 10-yard run by Willie Byrd, who rushed 37 times for 110 yards in the game.

But the Broncos' defense stiffened after that. Defensive lineman Derrick Spencer came up with a big play on third-and-nine on the 14-yard line, sacking McGee for a 6-yard loss. Facing fourthand-15 from the 20, Winston-Salem State had to go for the end zone. McGee tried to hook up with Brandon Free, who had caught 11 passes for 127 yards. But cornerback Derron Donald stepped around Free and knocked down the pass to end the game.
