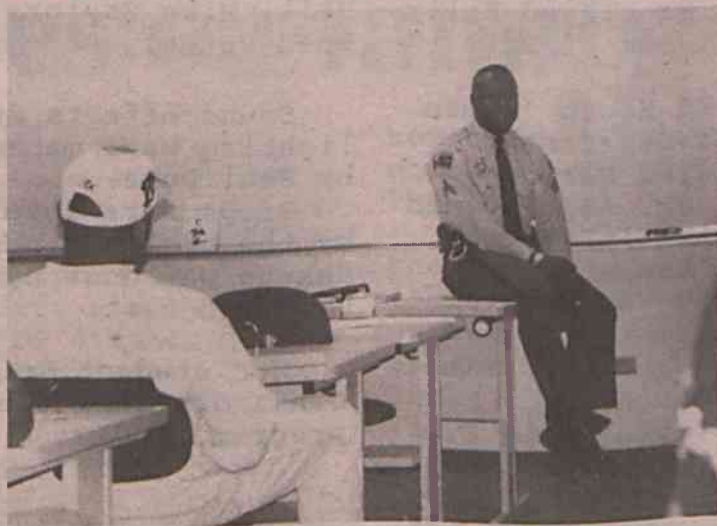
On Wednesday, April 13, Carl Brow, counselor in Student Development, presented "Japan: A Three-Year Perspective."
