Sharon Price is a counselor involved with the Sex Equity Grant. She is adviser for the Non-Traditional Student Association.


Price has a B.A. from UNC-W and an M.A. from Central Michigan University through SJAFB.

As Vice President of Academic Affairs Fouts' greatest responsibilities are to assist the president to ensure that instructional programs and facilities are the best possible.


Fouts' major goal is to work towards WCC's having the best instructional programs in North Carolina's community college system.
