
## More about new employees

He received his Bachelor's degree in agricultural education and poultry science from NC State.


Mitchell enjoys outdoor activities such as hunting and fishing.

He received his bachelor's degree in chemistry from Campbell University in 1976.


Later in 1982 he earned his DDS from UNC-Chapel Hill. From 1982 to 1998 he had a private practice in Smithfield.

Radford and his wife Alice of 21 years have a 17-year-old son Bill, a senior at North Johnston High School who plans to enroll at UNC-CH next fall.


Radford enjoys many outdoor activities. He hunts and fishes and is an avid Harley-Davidson fan with a bike of his own.
