Brettmann received a BA degree from Vanderbilt University, as well as a MEd degree in special education and learning disabilities from the University of North Florida.



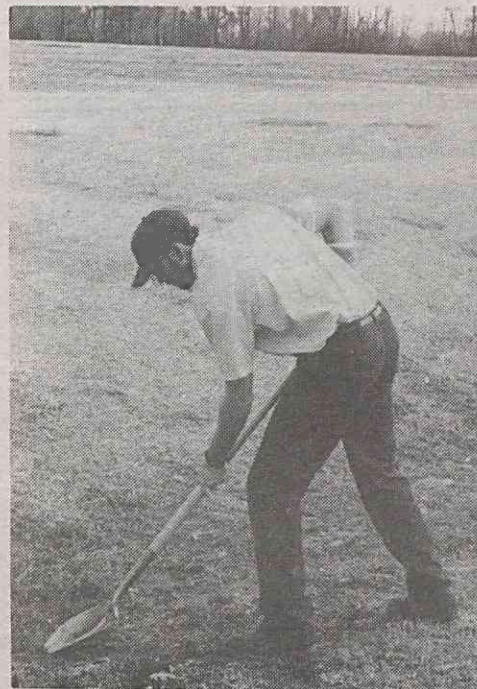
Angela C. Jackson

Mike Muncy

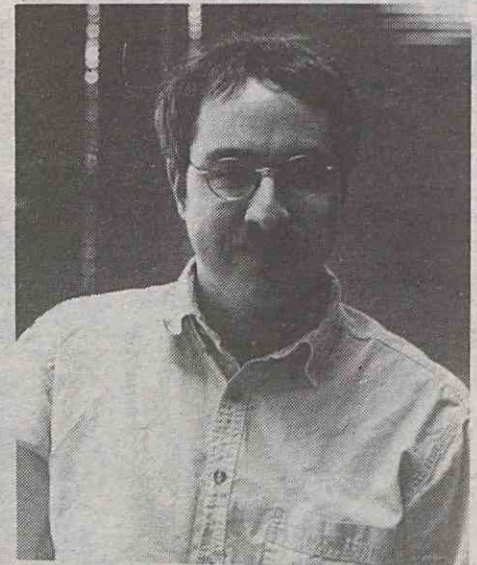
Mike Muncy, a native of Louisville, KY, is a groundskeeper at WCC.
