To become an ambassador, students must go through an application process. Brow said that being accepted is based on important factors such as the GPA, references, and an interview.


Present Ambassadors include Sara Beth Grey, Lucy Himes, Robert Gibson, Leigh Anne Quinn, and Ginger DeVore.
