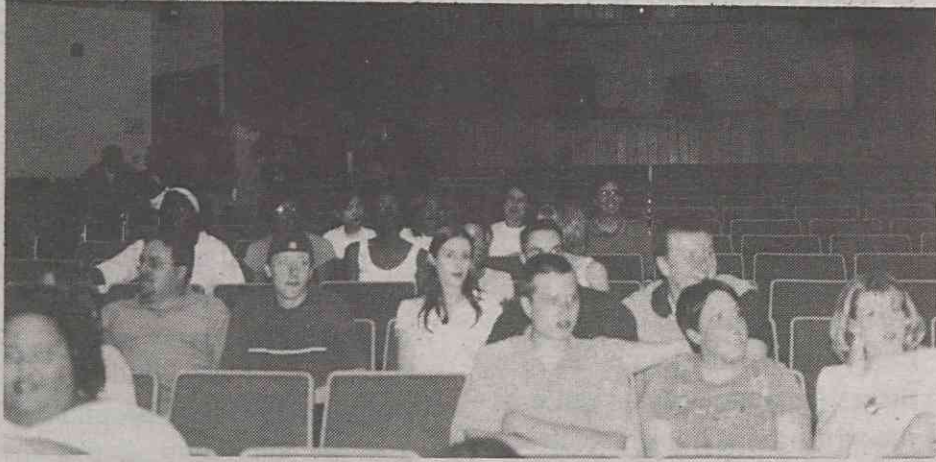


# Think Fast returns for Spring Fling
