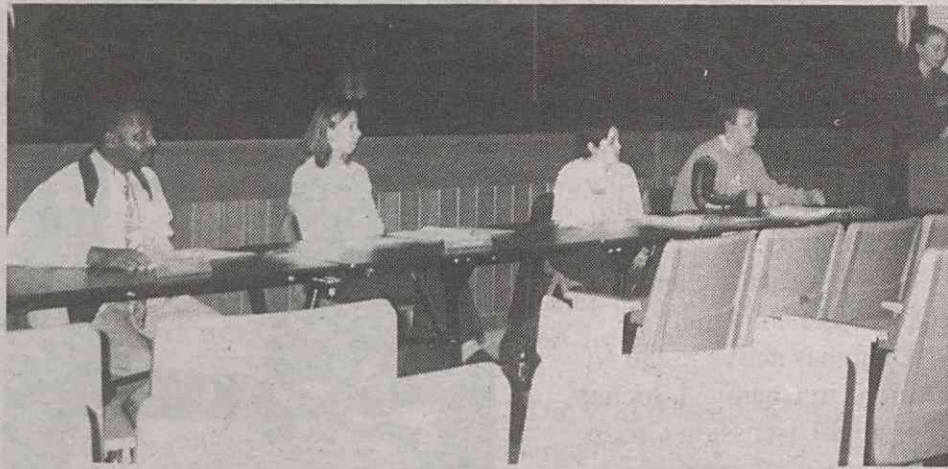


# SGA leaders plan busy spring semester

Various workshops at the Spring Conference included: Taking Control of your Finances, Business Etiquette and Protocol, Getting Financial Assistance for College, and Service Learning.

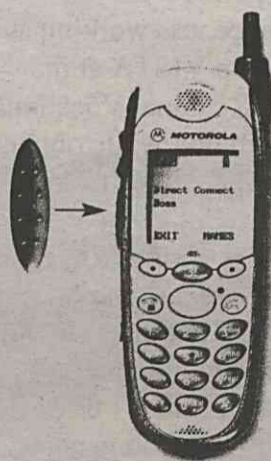
The Spring Conference was still held despite the recent loss of a leader, Mr. Daryl Jerome Mitchell, who passed away on March 7, 2002, from cancer.

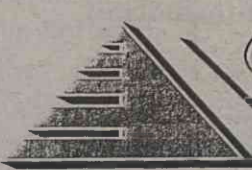
