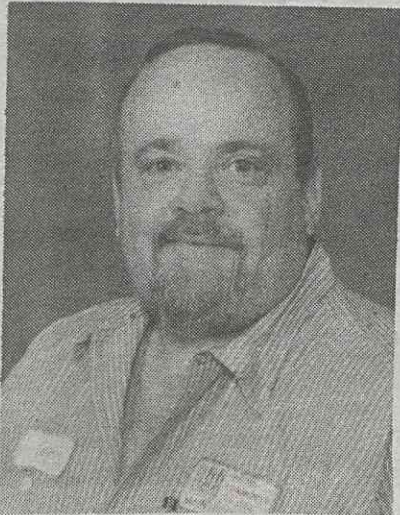


New employees abound in fall, spring

Derek Hubbard

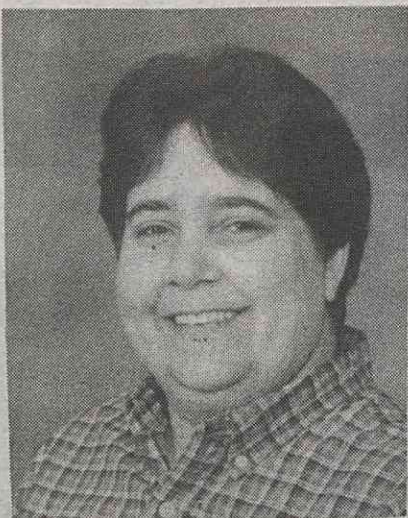
Derek Hubbard is a new housekeeper. His job duties include cleaning the WCC campus.

Barb Russo

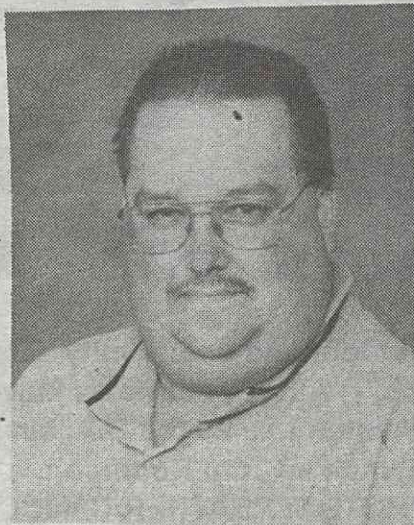
Barb Russo is a criminal justice instructor. She teaches criminal justice courses, specializing in corrections.

Sujatha Chittilla

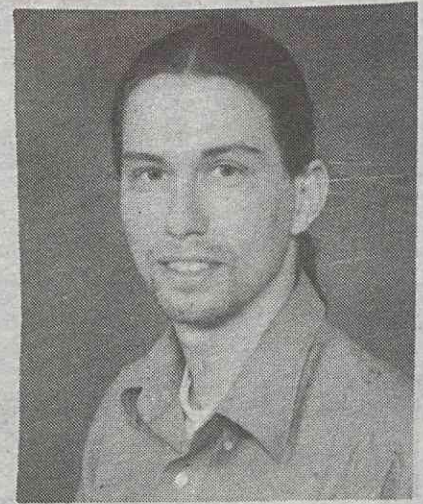
Sujatha Chittilla is the new Literacy Center Instructional Team Leader who provides instructional plans, evaluates student progress, and supports students and instructors.
