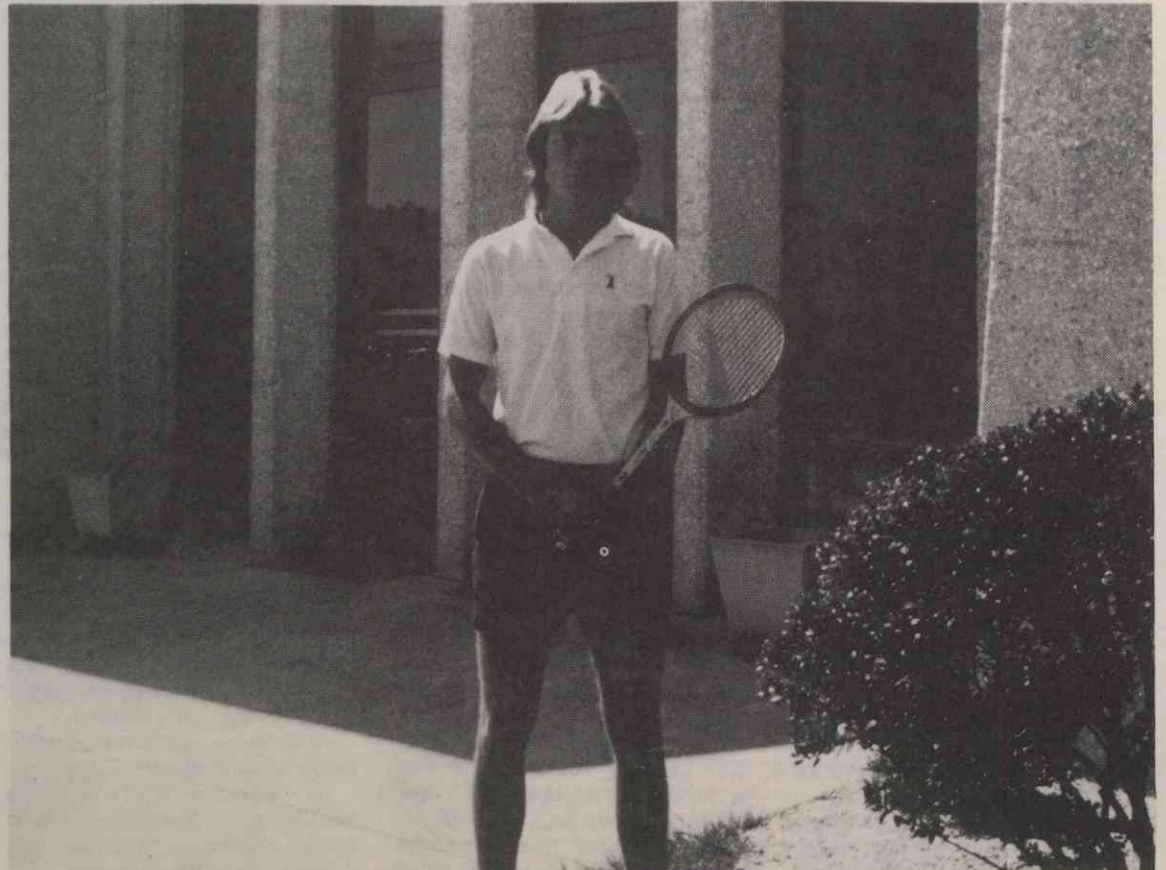


## College Trains Musicians
