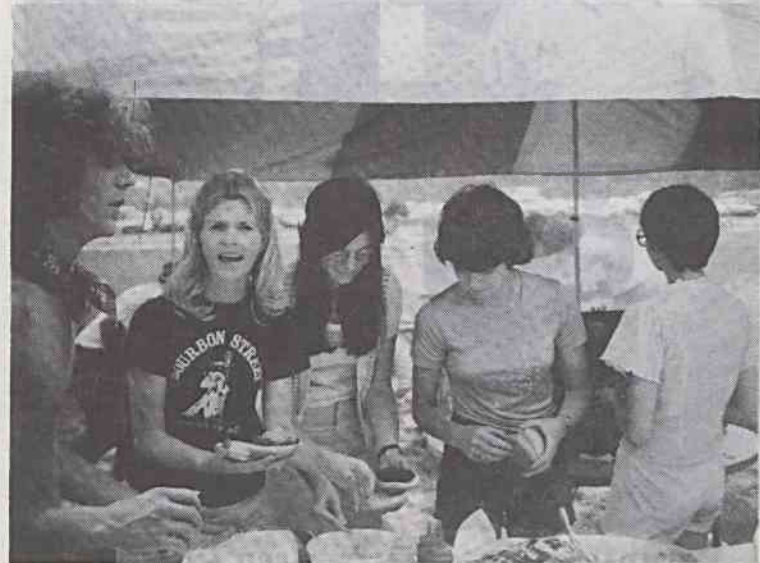
The Calm After The Storm

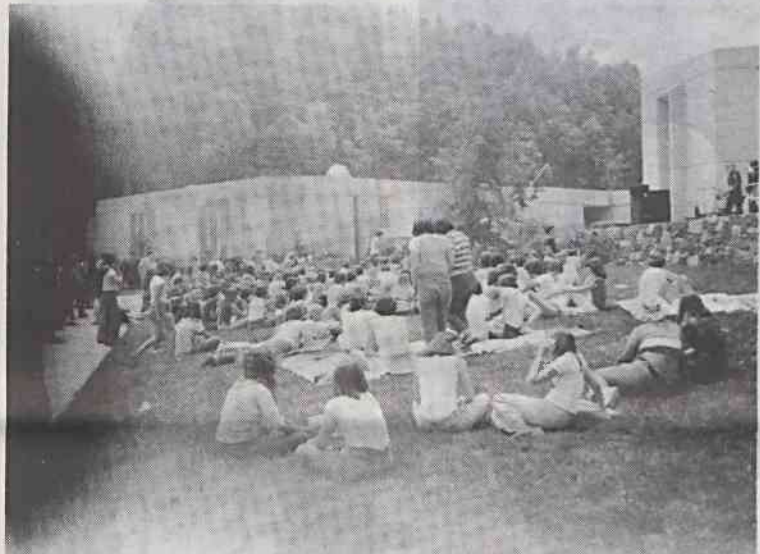

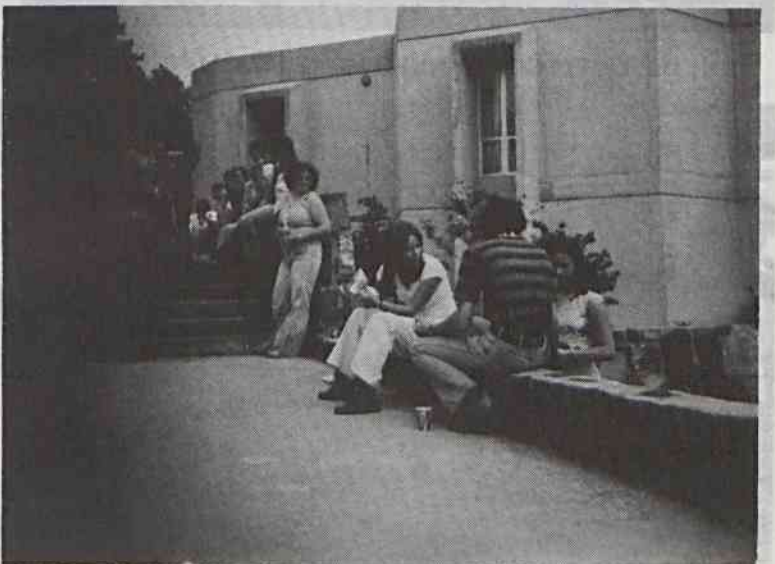
