The College offers several types of assistance to meet students' needs including Pell Grants, Supplemental Grants, State Incentive Grants, Scholarships Work-Study and Guaranteed Work-Study, and Guaranteed Student Loans. Funds received
from these programs could be used for living expenses as well as direct school costs. It is possible for students to receive help from several of these programs simultaneously if they demonstrate enough financial need.
Over $80 \%$ of our students completing the application process for 1984-85 have been approved for assistance. 84-85 applications will be taken through March 15, 1985. If approved, students could receive payments retroactive to Fall Quarter 1984.
