

Whitey Ford Sings the Blues is Erik "Everlast" Schrody's first album since the demise of House of Pain. This album can be best described as a mixture of hip-hop, folk, rock. Everlast's softer tunes show greater depth than most of his hip-hop tunes that just seem to ramble on a little too long sometimes. "Ends" poignantly shows the listener Everlast's near-death experience metaphorically. If Everlast focused more on creating more musically based pieces, this would be an incredibly solid album. Instead we have an often emotional, but also directionless album that works to a good extent.
